### ST MARGARET'S CHURCH

The funeral services for Norman Barber and Jean Hasler, held in St Margaret's church last month, were conducted by Tim Lee our Lay Minister. Tim writes: In Memoriam -

#### Norman Barber

Norman was brought up in the village and used to go fishing as a boy in the lake by the church. In his youth he had many friends in the village - he loved his 'prog rock' music and British motorbikes. He had 'green fingers' and like his father before him, won prizes in the village horticultural show.

Norman's first marriage didn't work out although he had two sons, Matthew and Ryan. He met his life partner, Geraldine, when he moved to Cornwall - they were together for 24 years. In later life they came back to Margaretting and lived at Crondon Hall Farm.

Norman sadly died much too early at 61. Friends travelled from all over Britain for his funeral on 15<sup>th</sup> January; there they heard of his zest for life and his spirit of adventure; they enjoyed listening to Led Zeppelin's *Bron yr Aur* and Yes' *Wondrous Stories* before he was finally laid to rest in the churchyard.

#### Jean Hasler

Jean grew up in Coptfold Hall Cottages on the Writtle Road and lived in or near to Margaretting all of her life. Jean met Cyril and they were married on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 1958 in St Margaret's. Cyril would help anyone out. He worked on local farms and Jean would join in with riddling potatoes and hoeing sugar beet, as well as being a loving mum to Peter and Chris. She was popular in the village, an active member of the Mothers Union and used to deliver the village newsletter in Maldon Road. She was a committed member of St Margaret's church, an excellent whist player and also enjoyed her bingo.

After Cyril retired, they moved to Maldon Road. Cyril sadly died in 2003. Jean kept up her friendships in the Over 60s, and enjoyed meeting her many friends for tea in the village hall.

In spite of deteriorating health and mobility, she faced life with spirit, faith and characteristic humour. Her funeral in St Margaret's on 16<sup>th</sup> January was packed with family and friends from the village. She will be much missed.

### DEMOCRATIC TIME

#### Parsonage Lane - water leak in field.

The clerk was asked to contact the land owner.

### MATTERS ARISING

#### Dog Fouling - Swan Lane:

Since contacting the dog warden the problem seemed improved.

#### Parking - Wantz Road

'Keep Clear' has been painted on the road at the entrance to the village hall but there are doubts this will solve the problem.

#### Roman/Main Road

The faulty street light and the damaged bollard in the centre of the road (pedestrian refuge island on the brow of the hill) have been reported.

#### Parking - Maldon Road

Enforcement Officers have visited Maldon Road and issued parking tickets. This action has led to some residents parking in their drives which has improved the situation.

#### Bollards - Margarettong Tye

The parish council is waiting for a response from Lord Petre regarding its request to install bollards on the green outside the White Hart.

### DEFIBRILLATOR

A quotation (£450) to fix the defibrillator to the parish office wall and connect it to the office electricity supply was accepted. This work will take place after the hall heating work.

### VILLAGE POND

Cllr Wallace reported that nearly all the ponds he had seen recently seemed to be in the same condition as our pond, i.e. covered in green algae.

### VILLAGE HALL

In light of the village hall's unsuccessful bid for funding towards the cost of the new heating system, Cllr Blurton has contacted the Village Hall Association to see if the parish council can help

## An open letter to EU citizens living in the Chelmsford area

Chelmsford is a diverse community. The skills and strengths that everyone who lives here brings to the area makes this a lively, forward-thinking and pleasant place to live. The City Council values everybody's contribution to the district - wherever you are from and however long you have lived here. In Chelmsford, there are around 3,500 residents who have come from the EU, EEA or Switzerland.

The UK Government is currently planning the country's exit from the European Union. Anyone who lives here and is from the EU can apply for 'settled status'.

Settled status gives you the legal right to continue living in the UK. It means you and your family keep your access to healthcare, benefits and pensions. It also means that your family members outside the UK can join you in future. It is estimated that around 50% of affected Chelmsford residents have applied so far.

If you have not applied for settled status yet, I would like to encourage you to complete your application. The deadline is 30 June 2021 and the application must be submitted through the GOV.uk website (see below).

If you do not have Internet access at home, or if you need to scan documents but don't have a device, you can come to the main library in Chelmsford City Centre. There, you can book a session on a computer and use a scanner to submit your application. For more information, visit:

Some European countries outside of the EU have reached separate agreements with the UK. Irish citizens will continue to enjoy their existing rights in the UK and do not need to apply, unless they wish to. To apply for settled status, and for further information, please visit:

## RECYCLING ANNOUNCEMENT

### Please note:

Chelmsford City Council will no longer be supplying residents with additional rolls of plastics sacks for recycling. In response to our climate and ecology emergency declared in July 2019 we have looked at areas where we can eliminate and or reduce single-use plastics within our organisation.

The decision has been made to no longer issue outposts with rolls of recycling sacks for plastics.

**We will continue to deliver a roll of plastic sacks to each household in Chelmsford once a year,** and we encourage

residents to maximise the space in each sack by remembering, "wash the bottle, squash the bottle and put the lid back on" to expel the air. Additionally, we are aware that some of the recycling sacks are used for unintended purposes, so we aim to stop that too. We will also no longer be providing plastic dog waste bags.
