PLANNING - NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER

Planning decisions received

25/00867/FUL Baskervilles, Roman Road

Proposal: Demolition of the existing commercial kennels and cattery buildings and residential dwelling and redevelopment of the site comprising seven dwellings. *Planning Permission Granted*

Community Infrastructure Levy

- (i) Larmar Engineering Site – no levy. The floor area of the new dwellings is smaller than the floor area of the engineering works building which previously occupied that site.
- (ii) Baskervilles Site – no information available. The sizes of properties on the plans have yet to be agreed.

- (ii) Conifer Trees – Large Overhanging Trees

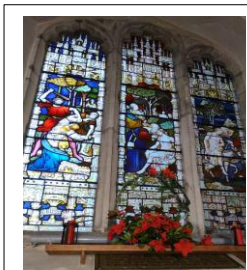
CHP to inspect the trees. Parish Council to obtain quotes for the tree work.

The Margaretting Village Hall and Recreation Ground Trust Committee extends its sincere gratitude to the village community for their continued support of our fundraising events over the past year. Your contributions have been instrumental in the maintenance and refurbishment of the hall.

Over November and December, £1,900 was raised at the Race Night, £665 came from the Dance Extravaganza, and the Coffee Morning Mini Christmas Market brought in £390. During the summer and autumn, MATES FC also held fundraising activities, contributing an additional £1,000 to the hall. When combined with earlier fundraisers from the year, the total amount raised reaches an impressive £6,131
