PRECEPT 2017/2018

SUPERFAST ESSEX PROGRAMME

The Superfast Essex programme is an Essex County Council initiative to roll out superfast broadband to homes and businesses in areas with the lowest speeds and limited connectivity. So far the programme has enabled over 73,000 homes and businesses with superfast broadband and aims to reach over 95% of the county by 2020. Cabinets which serve Margaretting are currently scheduled for upgrade between June 2017 and July 2018. Find out the latest broadband rollout information for your area at www.superfastessex.org/maps.

Eastern Angles is out on tour again this year from March to June. Inspired by the Border Ballads, Eastern Angles are taking on David Grieg's acclaimed play 'The Strange Undoing of Prudencia Hart'. Joining us as Director will be Hal Chambers who directed 'Ragnarok' at the Hush House.

It has toured extensively throughout Scotland and the world since 2011 with The National Theatre of Scotland at the helm and most recently it was given its London premiere by The Royal Court Theatre in 2013 as part of the Theatre Local Strand of site specific productions.

This show is unlike any other Eastern Angles Spring Tour to date, an immersive experience placing the audience in the heart of a bar with the story unfolding around them through folk music and performance.

Using a cast of four folk musicians/actors the show will tell the story of Prudencia Hart, an academic who sets off to attend a conference in Kelso in the Scottish borders. As the snow begins to fall, little does she know who or what awaits. Swept along on an enchanting dream like journey of self-discovery, Prudencia meets with magical moments, devilish encounters and wittily wild music.
