We continued throughout the year to hold a Holy Commun- In November our preparations for the Remembrance Day ion service on the third Sunday of each month and are forever grateful to Revd Tim Pigrem for leading this service. In June we said goodbye to our organist Claire Renowden. We are glad to report Claire remains a PCC member and Christine Lemon, with one of her 'Arts Roundabout' pupils, volunteered to play the organ for our monthly service.

At Eastertime the local school held its end of term service in church. The service celebrated the Easter message of love and hope as well as the end of the school term and pupil achievements.

July saw the return of Song Cycle. - another successful evening concert and enjoyed by all who came along. Song Cycle has been booked for a return visit this July.

During the summer months our new 'church is open today' sign, placed at the Church Lane junction in Main Road, attracted extra visitors to our open afternoons and to the Friends of Essex Churches riders and striders event held in September

In September newlyweds Heather and Robert Bredemear were blessed with the sound of St Margaret's church bells. Their moving and heartfelt marriage ceremony was conducted by Revd Matt Houghton. The organist for the service was Claire Renowden.

In October, the school held its Harvest Festival in church. The church was exquisitely decorated with autumnal and harvest floral displays and the children's excellent harvest themed art work. The children gave an important message to us all, reminding us that it is important to help others in need.

In the same month there was high praise indeed for St Margaret's Support Group in the architect's quinquennial inspection report. In his covering letter he writes: "I very much enjoyed my day at Margaretting last month and was really pleased - and massively impressed - to see how much good repair work and re-generated maintenance has been achieved at and around the church since 2014. It is a model of local voluntary organisation, good decision making and prolonged hard work!"

#### **DEMOCRATIC TIME**

#### **MATTERS ARISING**

Memorial Bench: Cllr D Smith confirmed this matter is in hand. Defibrillator - The Black Bull: Concerns were expressed that the defibrillator is yet to be sited. Cllr Quilter suggested re-visiting the garage as a possible site. Cllr Blurton thought a preferred option would be to use the outer wall of the parish office, where the electricity supply would be easily assessable. It was agreed to obtain a quotation for siting the defibrillator outside the parish office.

Dog Fouling - Swan Lane: The Clerk will be contacting the Dog Warden about the dog fouling complaints. Parking - Wantz Road: Cllr Grundy confirmed the South East Parking Partnership is dealing with this problem. The matter is in hand and the delay is probably due to the damp weather.

#### MAIN ROAD

The Clerk will report the faulty street light and the damaged bollard in the centre of road (pedestrian refuge island) on the brow of the hill.

#### MALDON ROAD

Playing Field: Cllr Wallace is organising the dispensers for the dog waste bags. The Bank End residents have been informed that CHP will be contacting them regarding the trees growing along the playing field boundary. Pavements: The Clerk confirmed most of the acorns had been cleared from the footpath outside number 41. Parking: The link for residents to report an offending vehicle has been published in the newsletter.

#### **SWAN LANE**

One member of the public was present. It was agreed the Clerk would contact Lord Petre to ask permission for the parish council to install bollards on the green outside The White Hart.

#### **IVY BARN LANE**

Cllr Blurton reported a planning appeal had been lodged for the piece of land abutting Four Oaks. However, due to problems with the computer system in the Planning Department no paperwork had been received.

#### VILLAGE HALL

Cllr Blurton reported October was a bumper month for the hall being hired. The new cleaner had settled in well and was very enthusiastic. Committee members were waiting to hear whether their grant application for funding, to cover the cost of the new central heating system, had been successful.

(Since the meeting it has been confirmed the village hall has been unsuccessful in its bid for funding.)

He is the third son Mrs. Bartrop
has lost in this war. The others
were Crpl. Geoffrey Holmes,
R.A.S.C., and Sergt. Bert Holmes,
R.A.F. Pte. J. Holmes, her late
husband, was killed in the first
Great War in 1918
