## MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - DECEMBER MEETING

SHOPPER BUS: The cost of the weekly 'Community Transport' from Margaretting to Tesco and Asda, is currently covered by ECC (Essex County Council). The ECC funding for this service is being withdrawn in April 2016. The parish council has been advised if villagers want to continue using the service they will have to become members of 'Community Transport', which is £12.50 a year, and phone to book the transport individually as well. The bus will take fourteen passengers and the journey will cost £4 each way.

Other options to keep this service running are being explored by the parish council. These include contacting Age Concern, Age UK and local taxis to find out what services they can offer.

## MARGARETTING PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY

When you're out walking you'll sometimes come across a broken stile or overgrown hedge obstructing a footpath. Or occasionally you might be blocked from walking on access land. By reporting these types of problems you'll be helping out the next walker that comes along. To report such problems please contact Essex County Council Highways. Telephone: 03456 037 631 or www.essexhighways.org

It's the responsibility of Essex County Council Highways to make sure paths and access land are open and easy for walkers to use and to keep them free from obstruction. The Highways authorities have a general duty "to assert and protect the rights of the public to the use and enjoyment" of paths in their area. They are legally responsible for maintaining the surface of the path, including bridges, and keeping it free of overgrowth. They have the power to require owners to cut back overhanging growth from the side of a path. For more information visit www.ramblers.org.uk
