MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JUNE MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Three members of the public present. Issues raised and discussed included cars and lorries parking on the pavements in Maldon Road, the Flood Alleviation Scheme and a suggestion that a hand rail was needed for the path leading to the parish office.

MALDON ROAD PLAY AREA

One reported incident - a blocked sewer drain. The sewer drain has now been cleared of ' items that would not dissolve'.

The youth shelter seats have been removed for re-galvanizing.

Reports of young adults from outside the village visiting the youth shelter on a regular basis were noted. All information has been passed to the local PSCO.

It was agreed to accept the Wicksteed quotation of £5,000 for the purchase and installation of toddler swings. Wicksteed will be asked to install the swings before the summer holidays.

ORTON CLOSE

Dog Mess: There have been reports of an increase in dog fouling on the pavements and grass verges in Orton Close. It was agreed to contact the dog warden for advice on leaflets, fines and information that could be published in the newsletter.

<u>Grass Verges</u>: Chelmsford City Council will be asked to cut the grass on the corner of Orton Close.

Street Lights: UK Power Network is responsible for the missing bracket for street light no. 2. The bracket was removed when the overhead lines were being refurbished.

VILLAGE PEACOCKS

A suggestion put forward by residents that the one remaining peacock in the village is lonely and that the community may wish to consider buying a mate for him has been noted. As was a report about this particular peacock being a bully and that he had scared away all the other peacocks. It was agreed to seek advice from the RSPB.

VILLAGE POND AND TREES

The dead tree in the pond has been removed. Ownership of the dead cherry trees in Parsonage Lane will be checked to establish whose responsibility it is to remove them.

VILLAGE ROADS, PAVEMENTS AND RIGHTS OF WAY

A copy of Chelmsford City Council's Extinguishment Order for footpath 21 has been received. A copy has been forwarded to the parish council's two footpaths' representatives.

VILLAGE PROJECTS

Nothing further to report on the lavender bank, village gateways and village hall road signs.
