ST MARGARET'S PCC

Members of St Margaret's PCC (Parochial Church Council), at their meeting on 11 June, were saddened to learn there had been no applicants to the advertisement for an Associate Priest for the benefice. The post which is being advertised via the Diocesan website will now be advertised in the Church Times.

As St Margaret's church, at this present time, is unable to offer a service every Sunday the dates and times for the services for all three churches in the benefice will be published in this newsletter.

The PCC with the help of Canon John Brown is hoping to provide a church service on every Sunday in St Margaret's from September onwards. However, there are concerns about finding a musician to play the piano or the church organ for some of these services. If anyone in the community is able to help the PCC would love to hear from you.

Other decisions taken by the PCC on 11 June included: providing a dedicated board in the church for the names of those parishioners wishing to be included in prayers; a tea and coffee rota for Sunday services. Tea, coffee and biscuits have for the past few years been provided by Helena Bewers, her sister Heather and other members of the congregation. Helena after many years has retired from the PCC and members of the PCC expressed their appreciation for the support and time both Helena and Heather have given to the work of the church.

There have been a number of church open afternoons held on the 1st and 3rd Sunday in each month. These have proved to be very popular so will continue on selected Sundays throughout the summer. This year's annual church bazaar will be held on Saturday, 22 November - in the village hall as usual.

MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JUNE MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Eight members of the public present. Matters raised included the flood alleviation scheme and a request for two skate board ramps to be installed in the Maldon Road playing field.

FLOOD ALLEVIATION SCHEME

Concerns were expressed that the delay to the flood alleviation scheme may mean the overall cost of the project will rise and result in unsightly changes to the design specification and inferior materials being used. We noted the land owners most affected by the scheme are finding it increasingly difficult to get any meaningful answers to their queries. We agreed to contact the **Environment Agency and Chelmsford** City Council for an update on why there has been such a long drawn out delay and assurances that there will be no cutting corners to the landscaping work.

SKATE BOARD RAMPS

A deputation of six young people attended the meeting with a request for the parish council's support and approval for the installation of ramps in the playing field. The design for the two ramps the young people would like to see in the field are low in height and noise and are suitable for bikes. The ramps would be placed at the far end of the field adjacent to the allotment hedge We explained the first action would be for the parish council to find out if Chelmsford City Council has any objections to some ramps being placed in the field. The next action would be for the young people to liaise with neighbours to assure them the ramps would not be seen or heard in their gardens. We explained we can explore funding opportunities once Chelmsford Council has confirmed it has no objections. The young people are planning to start raising funds at the family fun day.

PARISH COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP

Andrew Wallace who lives in Private Road, Margaretting was formally coopted onto the parish council.

VILLAGE PROJECTS

Lavender Bank: Nothing further to report. We are still waiting to receive a licence from Highways giving us permission to proceed with the placing of a wooden kerb along this bank.

Village Hall Road Sign: We have been informed that our request has to be approved by the Brentwood Local High- One to be located at the cul-de-sac end ways Panel. We feel this information is incorrect - we are not asking for funding crossing end of Parsonage Lane. There and Margaretting is part of the Chelmsford geographical area. We agreed to contact the Chelmsford Local Highways Panel's representative for advice.

Parish Council Office: The office is finished. We have received our £20,000 CIF grant towards the cost of the building. Arthur Radley will be invited to declare the office open as it was Arthur, when he was the treasurer of the village hall, who originally drew up the plans and design for a parish office.

Garden opposite the school: The railings have been painted. Thanks were expressed to Tony Smith for organising this project. A thank you letter is to be sent to Brian Smith.

Bus Shelters: We agreed the repairs to the shelter opposite the Black Bull should begin as soon as practicable. The area will be cordoned off whilst the repair works are taking place.

The litter bin for the new bus shelter outside the Red Lion has been installed and well used!

WOODEN SHED ON A12 SLIP ROAD

It has now been confirmed that the verge where the shed is sited is privately owned. The owner's agents have been made aware of the situation and are in contact with Chelmsford City Council's Planning Enforcement Team. The village PCSO is aware also and she in contact with the Enforcement Team too.

VILLAGE POND AND TREES

The pond weed is causing problems and needs removing. We agreed to contact The Conservation Volunteers to find out if they would be interested in the work.

RED DOG WASTE BINS

Requests were received for two bins. of Orton Close and one at the railway have been a number of complaints about filled dog waste bags being left in the verges or thrown in the hedges. We agreed to consult the residents at the far end of Orton Close to confirm the extent of this problem and to find out exactly where in Parsonage Lane a new bin is required.

FOOTPATHS & BRIDLEWAYS

Footpath 21: Nothing further to report. Footpath 17: Action is needed to keep this footpath open. This is an agenda item for July's meeting.

ALLOTMENTS & PLAY AREA

No reported incidents since the last meeting. The allotment rent money has been received and banked. Residents whose gardens abut the playing field have requested that the trees growing along the boundary fence are reduced in height. We agreed to obtain quotations for this work.
