MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JUNE MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Three members of the public present. Concerns raised and information shared included:

(i) Loud train whistles. Train drivers will only cease sounding the train whistles when Footpath 21 has been permanently closed. The closure will come into effect once the Secretary of State's consent has been received.

(ii) Maldon Road (Nunn's Crossing). Highways and Network Rail are aware of the flooding problem.

(iii) Anglia level crossing proposals. We have been advised that vehicle access to the two properties on the other side of the railway track will not be affected if the Parsonage Lane crossing is closed.

(iv) BT - slow internet connections. To ensure BT's database accurately reflects the actual number of faults occurring residents are advised to report all internet connection problems directly to their internet providers.

MALDON ROAD ALLOTMENTS AND PLAYING FIELD

No reported incidents. The annual allotment rents are due.

VILLAGE ROADS & FOOTPATHS

Parsonage Lane: It has been confirmed that the maintenance of the green in front of Glenside Cottages is Chelmsford City Council's responsibility. We now await the City Council's response to our request for a meeting to discuss the state of this green. One suggestion, recently put forward for consideration, is part of the green could provide parking spaces.

Maldon Road: It was agreed to contact BEST KEPT VILLAGE JUDGING Chelmsford City Council's Parking Enforcement Officers about the problems associated with vehicles being parked on the pavement and yellow lines.

Orton Close: The young skateboarders are aware there have been complaints about the car parking area being used for skateboarding.

Rights of Way: It was agreed to contact Laurence Page (ECC Definitive Maps Officer) to see if he has an easy to read A4 size map showing the Margaretting footpaths which can be photo copied and made available to the community.
