# MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JUNE MEETING

#### **DEMOCRATIC TIME**

Seven members of the public present. The issues raised and discussed were:

### (i) Eastern Angles

Jennie and Michael Scott had been invited to the meeting to discuss the handover arrangements for the Eastern Angles' annual visits to the village hall. Jennie and Michael, who have been organising these visits for many years, will be stepping aside next year. Members of the parish council agreed to take on the arrangements. The parish council recognised that Eastern Angles are worthy of support - they always provide first class performances. The parish council acknowledged Eastern Angles visits will continue to be a village hall project. All funds raised will go to the village hall.

(ii) Parsonage Lane Rail Crossing The parish council has withdrawn its objections to the closure of this crossing. Its concerns about access for the larger vehicles, dustcart and emergency services have been addressed by Network Rail. The parish council, whilst withdrawing its objections to the closure of this crossing, recognised the closure will cause disruption and inconvenience to those residents living on the other side of the railway line. The crossing gates will remain in place and securely locked. The gates will be unlocked as and when access is required. The utility and emergency services as well as the owners of the properties affected will be given a security key.

### (iii) Maldon Road

The road in the vicinity of El Rita continues to flood after a heavy downfall. It was noted this flooding has been reported many times to Essex County Highways and to date nothing has been done to sort out the problem. The parish council will once again report the problem to Essex County Highways.

(iv) Margaretting Brook
The meeting with the Environment
Agency to discuss clearing debris from

the brook will take place on Wednesday, 14th June. Representatives from Brookside Cottages and the Red Lion have been invited to attend.

# (v) Loose dogs

Several residents have expressed concerns about a dog which frequently escapes from its garden. There have been reports that this dog has been seen attacking other dogs. Residents have reported these attacks to the dog warden. The parish council agreed to write to Chelmer Housing Partnership to report the residents' concerns.

#### MARGARETTING TYE

<u>Red Telephone Box.</u> BT has confirmed the value of the kiosk and that it is responsible for the inside light.

#### MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

Access. It was noted that under the terms of the parish council's lease any request for access to the small fenced off parcel of land to the rear of 1 to 8 Bank End Cottages will have to be referred to the freeholder, Chelmsford City Council.

Swings. There is a problem with the new safety surface. The new surface has started to become loose in places. The resurfacing company which carried out the work last January will be asked to rectify the problem. Boundary fences. The dead tree, ivy and brambles have been cleared from the Maldon Road boundary.

#### MALDON ROAD ALLOTMENTS

This year's rents have been collected. Four allotments are available for rent. If Margaretting residents are not interested the parish council will contact Ingatestone parish council to see if its residents are interested in renting an allotment in Margaretting. See front page.

(i) Flag Master

Maurice Wright is retiring from his role as Margaretting Flag Master. Thanks were expressed for all the years Maurice has fulfilled this role. Cllr Andy Wallace volunteered to take over from Maurice and his offer was unanimously accepted and agreed by the parish council.

(ii) Enforcement of Yellow Lines
There have been complaints about car
owners parking on the yellow lines
and on the pavement in Maldon Road
leaving no room on the pavement for
buggies and mobility scooters.
South Essex Partnership is responsible for enforcing the parking regulations and issuing penalty fines.
