MALDON ROAD PARKING

The parish council has received more complaints about illegal parking, vehicles blocking the footway access ramps for pedestrians to cross the road safely and cars being driven on the pavements. The Highway Code states it is illegal to park on double yellow lines, at any time, unless you hold a disabled parking permit. Disabled badge holders are allowed to park on double yellow lines for up to three hours as long as they are not causing an obstruction. Also, it is illegal to drive on the pavement. Driving on the pavement causes damage to kerbs, pavement structures and underground utilities.

We all know, due to the long line of parked cars, Maldon Road is not wide enough for cars to pass each other at the same time. However, if the yellow lines are kept clear an available space is provided between parked vehicles for drivers to pull into. Don't forget you can report illegal parking online:

MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - UPDATE

Whilst we are not holding our regular monthly meeting, on government advice, Margarettling Parish Council is still functioning with the aid of modern day technology. The Council continues to carry out its daily duties such as dealing with problems received from residents, considering planning application and submitting comments, updating the new village website www.margarettling.com sharing information received from public bodies (see **below and next page**) and progressing projects that hopefully can be put in place once we come out of lockdown.

With regards to Planning applications and decisions as at 11 June 2020 they are as follows:-

APPLICATIONS:

Brooklands, Pennys Lane

Application No 20/00829/FUL

Proposal: Demolition of existing conservatory. Construction of part single and part two storey rear extension, first floor front extension. Conversion of garage to habitable space. Addition of balcony and two roof windows to rear with alterations to front fenestration.

Margarettling C of E Primary School, Pennys Lane

Application No 20/00680/FUL

Proposal: Alterations to create a secure entrance lobby, meeting room and upgraded play space.

COVID-19 UPDATES

NHS TRACK AND TRACE

With the development of Track and Trace, many people have been asking for advice around how this works. Please find below the official advice from the GOV.UK website on how the system works and advice on how to avoid being the victim of any possible scams as a result of the implementation of this system.

When we contact you:

If the NHS test and trace service contacts you, the service will use text messages, email or phone.

All texts or emails will ask you to sign into the NHS test and trace contact-tracing website.

If NHS test and trace calls you by phone, the service will be using a single phone number: 0300 013 5000.

All information you provide to the NHS test and trace service is held in strict confidence and will only be kept and used in line with the Data Protection Act 2018.

Contact tracers will:

- call you from 0300 013 5000
- send you text messages from 'NHS'
- ask for your full name and date of birth to confirm your identity, and postcode to offer support while self-isolating
- ask if you are experiencing any coronavirus symptoms
- provide advice on what you must do as you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive

Contact tracers will never:

- ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to us (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product of any kind
- ask for any details about your bank account
- ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone

- disclose any of your personal or medical information to your contacts
- provide medical advice on the treatment of any potential coronavirus symptoms
- ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
- ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS

If in doubt use the A, B, C of scam awareness:

A- Never Assume a caller, email or text is genuine.

B- Never Believe a caller, email or text is genuine.

C- Always Confirm by contacting a trusted number, family member, friend, your bank's fraud department or the police to check if it's genuine.

ESSEX FRAUD ALERT - ONLINE SHOPPING

With the majority of shops being shut due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our shopping habits have moved online. However, this has given rise to a new wave of people falling victim to online shopping fraud – reports to Action Fraud have increased by 51% since the start of lockdown. Always consider how much you trust the person you are buying from or selling to before parting with your hard earned money. There have also been a variety of online shopping frauds that relate to COVID-19, including the fraudulent sale of masks and other Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). In addition, criminals continue to be arrested for selling fake COVID-19 testing kits. **These kits often contain harmful chemicals and the government have stated that no home testing kits are available to buy in the UK.**

Finally, as always with online shopping – if it looks too good to be true, it usually is!

St Margaret's, Margaretting - New On-line Service

St Margaret's still has its doors shut for the moment - yet the 'church' is still open for business. Of course that rather depends what you mean by 'church'. The word church (*ecclesia* in Latin) originally referred to a group of people who were followers of *The Way* - trying to live life with reference to the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, meeting in secret in people's homes. When the Roman Empire became Christian in the 3rd century AD, church buildings were built; Christianity arrived soon after in the British Isles. There was probably some sort of church building in Margaretting in Roman times and the wall near the porch has some of those Roman bricks set in. In these pandemic times it looks rather like we have reverted back to the earliest model of church, except we can be connected by new technology.

Some of us have been joining the on-line community of people in Ingatestone and elsewhere for Sunday services. We don't expect to be having normal church services at Margaretting for a while, as there would be too many restrictions on what we can do, and people who are self-isolating would still be excluded from coming. We will instead have a short on-line service beamed from Margaretting church on *YouTube*, on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month. We'll be sending round a link by email; you can also pick this up by an on-line search for 'Margaretting Church service', the church's website or through the Margaretting parish website e-voice.org.uk/margaretting/st-margaret-s-church/. The first on-line service will be on 5th July; it can be seen any time of the day from then.

CHURCH SERVICES IN LOCKDOWN

Ingatestone Church is livestreaming worship on Facebook: *St. Edmund and St. Mary's Church, Ingatestone*
Sundays 10.00 am Holy Communion (about one hour); every other day **9.30 am Morning Prayer** and **9.30 pm Compline** (about 15 minutes). The livestream services can also be picked up at any other time, so you can watch the Compline service for example just before bedtime - a peaceful and spiritual end to the day.



COUNTRY PARKS

We are pleased to confirm that Essex County Council Country Parks are back to normal opening hours. All parks will be open from 8am to dusk.

The parks, car parks and toilets will be open to the public. However, the children's play equipment, visitor centres and cafes will remain closed, in line with government guidance.

LIBRARIES

We are now preparing a phased approach to re-open libraries in line with government guidelines. From Monday 6 July 2020, sixteen libraries across Essex will re-open: Basildon*, Billericay, Braintree, Brentwood, Chelmsford, Clacton, Colchester, Dunmow, Epping, Harlow, Harwich, Maldon, Rayleigh, Rochford, South Benfleet and Witham. The initial sixteen sites re-opening were selected as they also provide Registration Services, and therefore allow this important service to be more easily delivered too. *Basildon Library re-opening date is subject to the Basildon Centre re-opening.

PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY

The parish council has received several complaints and queries about who and what can use the different types of PROW. The following may help answer those queries.

What is a right of way?

A right of way is a path that anyone has the legal right to use on foot and sometimes using other forms of transport.

Footpaths: This public right of way is meant for pedestrians only. You are allowed to walk your dog as long as it is under your close control. When walking a dog, you must ensure that it keeps to the public footpath and does not trespass into nearby properties. Prams, pushchair or wheelchairs can also be used on a footpath.

Bridleways: These are meant for walkers, horse riders and bicyclists. Bicyclists are expected to give way to walkers and horse riders.

Byways Open To All Traffic (BOAT): These byways are normally marked "byways" and are open to motorists, bicyclists, horse riders, motorcyclists and pedestrians. As with public tarmac road networks, motorists must ensure that they are legally authorised to use BOATs (i.e. registered, taxed, insured and MoT'd).

Restricted Byways: Restricted Byways are created under the Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006. They are open to the traffic mentioned above in BOATs, but exclude motor vehicles and motorcycles.
