Items discussed at May's parish council meeting

Queen's Jubilee: It was agreed the parish council would issue the payments and all donations would be paid into the parish council account.

Maldon Road Allotments: It was reported Ingatestone's allotments cost 28p a square metre. Using the Ingatestone rate, plus the share of water costs, Margaretting allotments would cost £57.28. The Clerk is to find costs of other local allotment rents and leases.

Maldon Road Playing Field: Ouad bikes were seen on the field on Easter Sunday; the owners had been informed these bikes were not permitted on the field. It was agreed to put a sign on the gate prohibiting motorised vehicles from the playing field. The gate hanging post has been hit - although it is still working.

There may be a problem with drugs in the playing field as several suspicious bags had been found.

There has been some shrinkage on the safety surfacing. It was agreed to wait for the next safety inspection before taking any action over the safety surface.

Village Trees: Quotes to prune the Willow tree at Mar-£820 Bartletts Tree Surgeons. Bartletts quote for the War Memorial Pear trees, which in 2019 was £240, was £250. It was agreed, unless the third quote comes in more favourable, to go with Bartletts.

A request for a TPO for the Oak Tree on the redundant service station boundary has been made.

Platinum Jubilee Tree: It was noted a tree should not be planted within a metre of a concrete/tarmacked surface. Discussion on a suitable tree and site was deferred to the

Hylands Parking Charges: Some small business owners had suggested the park might revert back to free parking on a Sunday and bank holidays.

Cllr Grundy reported people were still using the park; at some point data on usage would be released.

Village Hall Matters: It was reported that the village hall was trying to cut costs.

Pot Holes. The Clerk will report the pot hole in Maldon Road and identify and notify Cllr I Grundy where the pot holes are in Swan Lane.

Bollards: The Clerk has been asked to follow up the parish council's request for new bollards in Main Road by The Saddlery.

BEES AT MARGRETTING CHURCH

If you walk round the right hand side of Margaretting Church, you will see lots of bees in the air- walk swiftly past and don't hang around! There have been bees behind the oak boarding for at least 50 years. However the colony at the back of the church was nearly wiped out by woodpeckers during the winter- woodpeckers knock holes in wood looking for grubs and a colony of bees makes a nice dinner! The colony on the side of the church is stronger and may have 60,000 bees at this time of year. If you want to watch them, stand on the step a couple of yards from the bees keeping your body close to the building out of the flight path, and you can watch the comings and goings. The outside of a colony looks rather like a busy airport: on a sunny day a hundred bees laden with their precious cargoes may be circling as they come into land, checking their location against the scene in their memory; some approach with bodies horizontal to the ground like planes in level flight: these will be carrying nectar in their honey stomachs. In the colony nectar will be passed round 'mouth to mouth' as an energy drink for the bees; if deposited in the comb it will eventually thicken into honey. Other bees

land with heads raised and legs out like small planes with the undercarriage down - these are pollen-bearers, carrying balls of pollen in hair 'nets' on their legs- you can often glimpse the pollen as a flash of yellow or orange. Pollen is protein, necessary for young grubs- seeing bees with pollen is a sign that the colony is doing well. Once each bee has found a free landing spot she touches down and gingerly approaches 'immigration' - guard bees on the entrance of the hive, who check her scent before allowing her in. (Workers are all female. Drones on the other hand, larger with big black eyes, will be let in without checks in any colony- a nice life but a short one.) Once she has disappeared inside the hive the worker bee may walk quite a long way to find the comb where she can hand over her precious cargo. If she has found a really good crop she may even do a 'waggle dance' to tell other bees where to find these flowers. Once she has done her duty, it's back to work again – another long trip to the flowers a mile or more away: she may make up to ten trips on a summer's day, resting only at night.
