#### VILLAGE SITES

War memorial site: The recent accident at the cross roads involving a van and a car which resulted in the van driving into the war memorial posts was reported and noted.

Thanks were expressed to Mr Maurice Wright and Cllrs Blurton and Scott for their swift response in re-installing the posts.

The van's insurance company and our insurers have been informed that three of the posts are damaged.

Main Road: Discussions on traffic calming ideas for the cross roads were deferred to our July meeting when more information will be available. We noted one of the surface drains at the cross roads is still blocked despite a report received from Essex County Council Highways (ECC) that this matter had been dealt with. A photo of the drain is to be sent to ECC to prove this defect is still in need of attention. Village Roads: We continue to receive reports of pot holes requiring urgent attention. All reports are referred to ECC Highways.

Lavender Bank: Enquiries are being made as to the ownership (ECC, CCC or CHP) of this bank. Once ownership is established details of our plans to install railway sleepers along the pavement edge of the bank will be forwarded to them for comments.

<u>Village Sign</u>: Discussion on the poor condition of the village sign which is considered to be beyond repair was deferred to our June meeting.

Village Pond: 14 ducklings have been seen on the pond.

Questions were raised as to how long they would survive.

Village Trees: The Jubilee Oak has been planted on the Maldon Road green.

Bus Shelters: The cleaning arrangements for the bus shelters will be discussed at our June meeting.

#### ALLOTMENTS AND PLAY AREA

The annual rents for the allotments have been collected. We are looking to obtain a grant from the Edible Essex Project to install two further water troughs.

#### BRIDLEWAY AND FOOTPATHS

Bridleway number 43: The defects reported to ECC Highways several months ago still require attention. We noted responsibility for these repairs has been delegated to CCC. We agreed to send photos of the various defects direct to CCC to support our view that immediate action is required.

### PARISH COUNCIL OFFICE

We agreed to approach the following organisations to see if our project meets their funding criteria: ECC Community Initiatives Fund; Essex Environment Trust; Derbyshire Environment Trust; Tom Amos Charity; Essex Community Foundation and MAZTEC.

#### FLOOD ALLEVIATION SCHEME

Work has yet to start on the scheme. The public drop-in and exhibition in the village hall is from 2pm to 7pm on Friday, 7th June.

### DIPLÔME DE CITOYEN

Congratulations to Jordanne Wood who recently received distinction in the Diplôme de Citoyen (formerly European Citizenship Award) presented with the support of the Commission of the European Union by MP David Blunkett. Jordanne won the award at this level with only a handful of students from her year group of over 200 pupils. The diploma was filled in throughout her time at secondary school (Anglo European) and assessment of her involvement as a global citizen; taking into account factors such as fluency in languages, academic success, charitable activities and participation in foreign exchange programs.

The meeting was attended by seven parish councillors and three members of the public. The parish council presented its annual report and accounts for the 2012/2013 financial year. ### **ESSEX AGE UK**

Front page news in Essex Age UK's newspaper mentions how a carefully handwritten note and a £10 donation received from Mrs May Day who lives in Margaretting had brought tears to the eyes of the Age UK team who during the bad weather this winter coordinated deliveries of essential supplies to older people living in the county. Essex Age UK together with Essex Community Foundation and the British Red Cross delivered 600 keep-warm packs and 400 food packs. If the heating broke down the Red Cross provided portable fan heaters. The £10 donation from May tucked inside a handwritten note to say 'thank you' means everything to the team because it shows how much people appreciate what they do and what a difference it makes. Donating gets to the very heart of what Age UK do and every penny of that £10 will help Age UK provide the same kind of vital services to others.
