Parking in Maldon Road: Concerns were expressed about the double parking at the top of Maldon Road and cars and lorries having to drive over the pavement to allow traffic to pass. In order to determine the extent of the problem it was agreed to monitor the parking. It was suggested that one solution to the problem might be to extend the double yellow lines to Parsonage Lane on one side of the road.

## MALDON ROAD PLAY AREA

#### VILLAGE POND AND TREES

The dead tree in the pond is to be removed on 21 May. It was reported that one of the flowering cherry trees in Maldon Road is in need of attention. Residents concerns about heating fuel odours wafting from a surface water drain in Main Road opposite the pond were noted. It was thought this could be due to fuel leaking from a domestic oil tank. These concerns are being investigated by Chelmsford City Council and the Environment Agency.

#### VILLAGE ROADS, PAVEMENTS AND RIGHTS OF WAY

Margaretting/Writtle/ Main Road: We have been informed that Essex Highways Engineers have concluded that the results of the speed survey (carried out in August 2013 for these three roads) did not support our request for a reduction in the current speed limit. The Chelmsford Local Highways Panel has asked Essex Highways to reconsider this decision.

#### VILLAGE PROJECTS

Lavender Bank: The latest information required by Essex Highways Engineers implies that our request is now back at stage one of their procedures.

Our initial request to install a retaining

Our initial request to install a retaining border to this bank was made three years ago.

Village Hall Road Sign: We noted it has taken over 18 months to receive Highways approval to install this sign. We await the outcome of Cllr Grundy's enquiry to the Highways Engineers asking them why their quote is so high. Meanwhile, we agreed to obtain a third quote.

Village Gateways: Essex Highways Engineers have confirmed that the gates we wish to install do not meet their criteria. We agreed to refer this project to the Chelmsford Highways

#### VILLAGE PEACOCKS

Concerns about the peacocks have been expressed to the parish council. It has been reported that the young male and breeding female disappeared this year leaving the older male by himself and that if he is the last one it would be cruel to leave him alone. The parish council has been asked to consider whether he could be moved to a location where there are females or if people want to keep him in the village, maybe a mate could be found?

We agreed the village peacocks are classified as wild birds and as such we do not have the authority to remove them from the village.

#### STAND UP FOR SADIE

Please help raise £60,000 for a life changing operation for a little girl called Sadie Fisk who lives in Maldon Road. Sadie is 3 yrs old and was born 3 months prematurely in May 2012. Due to Sadie's early arrival into the world, she was diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy just after her 1<sup>st</sup> Birthday. Consequently Sadie is unable to sit unaided, stand or walk. Her family are trying to raise £60,000 by January 2016 for Sadie to have specialist surgery called Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy (SDR) at Great Ormond Street Hospital and this will enable her to walk, something that even with lifelong physiotherapy is something that Sadie is never likely to achieve.
