#### **DEMOCRATIC TIME**

Three members of the public present. Their concerns about suspicious activ- No reported incidents. ities taking place in the village will be reported to Essex Police.

### VILLAGE ROADS & FOOTPATHS

Orton Close: Residents' complaints about children skateboarding in the resurfaced parking area at the top of this road were noted.

Parsonage Lane: Nothing further to report on our request for a meeting with CHP to discuss how best to prevent any further damage to the green in front of Glenside Cottage.

Rights of Way: Linking of Bridleway *Nos. 11, 44 and 54 -* ECC Highways (Laurence Page -Definitive Maps Officer) would welcome information about the original route/location for these three bridleways.

The following reports will be forwarded to Highways for action: Bridleway No 43 (off Swan Lane) fallen tree needs clearing. Footpath No 35 - indicator post near church needs replacing.

### **REPAIRS & MAINTENANCE**

Bus Shelters: Nothing further to report. Still seeking more quotes for repairing and painting the shelter opposite the Red Lion.

Lavender Bank: Nothing further to report. It is still proving difficult to find contractors to quote for the work.

The level of reserves held and carried forward each year was discussed. It was also suggested another project worth considering is the installation of railings for the play equipment in the Maldon Road playing field.

### BROADBAND/TELEPHONE SERVICE

BT's (Openreach) response (via our MP) about the broadband/telephone services for Orton Close and Maldon Road was discussed. We agreed BT's response that it could detect no underlying issue was disappointing. We agreed also to advise residents to report faults to BT as and when these occur so that the information held on BT's database more accurately reflects the service received in Margaretting. ## TELEPHONE SERVICE - EXTRACT FROM BT'S RESPONSE

'Overall in all three areas (*since 2008 - Orton Close, Maldon Road, Bank End*) only 8 households had more than 4 faults reported. Most had less than 4 and 16 had reported no faults since service was connected. This would not indicate an underlying issue. There would be no plans to upgrade the copper network to the village in its entirety.......However, we do monitor fault levels on our network closely and if an area is found to have an abnormally high fault rate then we will take action to fix it.'
