MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - THURSDAY, 12th APRIL

DEMOCRATIC TIME

The chairman reported on the parking problems at the local school. He said he had been expecting the Headteacher to attend the parish council meeting. Cllr Grundy outlined the 3PR scheme (resources to help prevent inconsiderate, illegal and dangerous parking in the vicinity of a school); this scheme has a proven success in other schools. The chairman agreed to contact the Headteacher with this information.

WANTZ ROAD

Residents have expressed concerns about the parking in Wantz Road. The parked cars are also causing difficulties for the users of the village hall. Residents will be petitioning Essex Highways. Cllr Grundy suggested the parish council apply for a 'Junction Protection'.

In order for Cllr Grundy to pursue this suggestion photographs of the parked cars in Wantz Road will be taken and sent to Cllr Grundy.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

The parish council has received a quotation for the tree work at the rear of Broadoaks. It was noted, in line with financial regulations, another quotation is needed before a decision can be made. The play equipment and safety surfacing will be inspected by ROSPA sometime during May/June.

The parish council is reviewing the signs on the gate to deter dog fouling. The Clerk agreed to contact the dog wardens to find out what signs are available from them.

SWAN LANE

Essex Highways has approved the quiet lane proposal.

MAIN ROAD

Old Shell site: The advertising board has been removed from the grass verge. It was reported that someone had been sleeping in the hut.

Trees: Arrangements are in hand to prune the two weeping pear trees at the War Memorial.

Village Sign - The church and the school are to be asked if they would be interested in having the old sign. <u>Grass Verges</u> - The Clerk reported she had booked the Parish Cleansing Team. It was agreed to ask the team to cut back the vegetation on the verges and pathways on both sides of the road from the top of the hill down to the school.
