For the gardeners amongst you here are some tips for June: Pinch out the side shoots on your tomatoes. Hoe borders to keep the weeds down. Harvest early potatoes, lettuce, radish and other salads. Mow lawns weekly leaving an area uncut for the wildlife. Regularly water pots.

As both the air and soil temperatures are higher at the moment, it is a great time to sow seeds and plant young plants. Just remember to keep sufficiently watered to promote

healthy growth.

The birds will be busy collecting caterpillars for their young and bees, butterflies and moths are all helping to pollinate the flowers. Please find time to sit and enjoy watching them.

Items discussed at April's parish council meeting

Queen's Jubilee: Banners advertising the event have been erected at the crossroads; a flyer has been designed to be circulated with the newsletter; the Black Bull will apply for an alcohol licence for the event (temporary event notice). Blue Plague: A request to erect a plague to commemorate Maud and Mildred Petre will be referred to Lord Petre to see if the Petre family was approached in the first instance. Mildred was a pioneer with Bentley and is listed in the Guinness Book of Records.

Maldon Road Allotments: The parish council is looking to seek a variation to the terms of its lease with Chelmsford City Council to allow small garden sheds (6' x 4') to be erected on the allotments.

Maldon Road Playing Field: CHP has confirmed the large conifer trees growing along the boundary do belong to CHP and it would not be doing anything to reduce their size because the cost would be too much for its budget and the trees are not detrimental to its properties. The parish council is going to contact CHP to see if the trees can be trimmed back with a pole saw.

Margaretting Tye: Permission has been obtained to cut back the weeping willow growing by the White Hart at Margaretting Tye. Quotes have been requested from three local tree surgeons.

War Memorial: The tree surgeon awarded the work for the weeping willow at the Tye will be asked to look at the two weeping pear trees on the war memorial green.

Queen's Green Canopy scheme. The parish council will check the distance allowed from the road for trees planted in the verge.

Spring Litter Clean: There had been a very poor turn out. Parish councillors cleared their own areas and one resident cleared Parsonage Lane.

A12: The road is to be rebuilt between junctions 13 and 15. The work will start this Autumn and will involve removing some foundations and replacing the concrete road surface with asphalt. To cause the least disturbance possible there will be a contraflow traffic system.

Penny's planning meant that when we had to close because of Covid we were prepared. Secondly, the smooth day to day running of the premises was totally down to Lynn Cameron. As booking secretary she coped with the communication with our hirers, keeping them in touch and informed. She managed all the health requirements, posters and goodness knows what. As secretary she did a splendid job obtaining grants to help us survive. Thirdly, we got valuable support from Government, City Council, Parish Council and the community.
