ST MARGARET, MARGARETTING

An extract from Simon Jenkins' book England's' Thousand best churches

Half the fun of Margaretting is in getting there. It lies some way from its village on the far side of a level crossing whose sole purpose is to serve the church and rectory next door. The church has a rare 15th-century wood framed tower. It rests on ten posts with arched braces and contains a peal of original bells. The belfry and spire are shingled. The wooden porch is Tudor, with traceried open sides and a steep gable. Inside there is one treasure, the astonishing east wall. This is covered in pargeting, familiar on Essex cottages but not on church walls, here depicting the Feeding of the Multitude. Dated 1678, it frames an almost complete 15th-century Tree of Jesse window. Vines rise out of Jesse's body, representing the wine of the Eucharist. The figures are set in roundels, animated against floral backgrounds the colours muted but complete. Such glass was manufactured by Flemish glaziers, either on the

The churchyard is a peaceful place, so much so that on my visit the tower had been taken over by a large bees' nest. Only the intermittent roar of a passing train disturbed their work.

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Four members of the public present. Two of whom, Lorraine Kerry and Michelle Barnes, had been invited to attend the meeting; they had previously expressed an interest in being considered as candidates for the parish council vacancies.

The two candidates were invited to say something about themselves. Members of the parish council were given the opportunity to ask questions of the candidates and the chairman's proposal that the two candidates be coopted onto the parish council was unanimously agreed. Contact details for Lorraine and Michelle will be posted on the parish notice board. It was noted the parish council still has

one further vacancy to fill and that a former member of the parish council has put his name forward.

The issues raised and discussed during democratic time included:

- (i) <u>Parsonage Lane Rail Crossing</u> The installation of notices informing the public there is no pedestrian access over the railway crossing was noted.
- (ii) Margaretting School parking
 We agreed to send a summary of the
 parish council's efforts and actions to
 resolve this issue to the headteacher,
 Mrs Maire O'Regan. Cllr Andy Wallace agreed to be the parish council's
 link person with the school.

Cllr Ian Grundy reported on the City Council's school parking initiative to be launched on 27 March. The main thrust will be to encourage pupils to motivate parents, carers and school gate parkers to find a safer place to park. It is hoped this new initiative will include details of how to set up a 'walking bus' scheme in Margaretting.

(iii) Margaretting Brook

We still await a response to our request to the Environment Agency to remove the detritus from the brook.

(iv) Flood Alleviation Scheme
The date for the High Court of Justice
Hearing (Court of Appeal) has been
fixed for 28 and 29 June 2017.

MARGARETTING TYE

Cllr Ian Grundy volunteered to ask the City Council's legal team to check BT's terms and conditions for the adoption of the red telephone box at the Tye. Residents will be asked for ideas for the future use of the red box when the adoption has taken place.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

No reported incidents.

The safety surface for the swings has been renewed. The hedge between the allotments and the playing field is to be cut back to a height of 2m. Stephen Mayhew's Tree Surgery and Garden Maintenance Company will complete this work before the end of March.

VILLAGE PROJECTS

Village Sign: The parish council's decision to seek funding from Essex County Council's Community Initiative Fund (CIF) to renew the village sign by the pond was discussed. It was noted expression of interest forms will be available in March. This is the first stage in the funding process. The final stage, the actual allocation of funds, will take place in November.

VILLAGE RIGHTS OF WAY

Green Lanes Bridleway No 43 (Swan Lane to Crondon House): Still no action to repair the damage reported previously - the missing bollard, damaged handrail and fence.

ACCOUNTS

Expenditure agreed this month: £672 - Sovereign (safety surface for the swings) £474 - Village Hall Trust (contribution towards insurance costs) £650 - Relief in Need Trust (balance of Queen's 90th birthday)

VILLAGE TREES

We agreed to check if the split tree opposite Elm Cottage, Main Road, reported last month, has been inspected by the City Council

351 BUS ROUTE

We agreed to continue to monitor this bus service even though there have been recent reports that the service had improved. See next page FLY TIPPING

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The following application was received for comment:

17/00130/FUL - Longcroft, Maldon Road: Demolition of single storey extension. Creation of drive from existing road access. Construction of low profile, semi subterranean single storey three bedroom dwelling. In addition to the above the City

Council invited our comments on an outline planning application to build 140 homes on farm land between Margaretting and Ingatestone.

This application will be considered by Brentwood Borough Council as the farm land is in the borough of Brentwood.

The following decisions were noted: 16/01986/FUL - Jonette, Penny's Lane: Demolition of existing outbuilding and garage. Single storey side extension. Alterations to existing roof to create hipped roof form, new front porch. New detached garage and gym.
