PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Planning Applications received in February

Kennets, Maldon Road

Application No: 23/00080/FUL Proposal: Loft conversion with front and rear dormers.

Ynamit, Maldon Road

(i) Application No. 22/02130/FUL
Proposal: Demolition of existing derelict building and construction of annex ancillary to main dwelling.
(ii) Application No. 22/02128/FUL

Proposal: Raise the roof to create first floor accommodation with dormer windows. Two storey front extension and single storey rear extension.

Items discussed at January and February's meetings

<u>Hylands Park</u>: It was reported people were getting their coffees from Rose Café, leaving their vehicles in the café car park, then walking over the road to Hylands Park. The parish council agreed to contact the City Council to find out if figures are available for Hylands Car Park usage since the inception of its parking charges scheme.

<u>CCC Highway Rangers</u>: Funding for this service has been withdrawn as from March 2023.

<u>Parish Council Office Telephone and Broadband</u>: The BT office telephone contract has been cancelled. The BT Broadband facility will continue for the time being while a new contract/provider is being explored.

It was agreed to clean and upgrade the office computer before deciding whether to purchase a new one May Elections: Photo ID requirements. See back page <u>Police</u>: Local burglary and vehicle offences for the last three years were made available at the meeting. PC Scott Smith (Community Safety Officer) was unable to attend the meeting but if required will attend the Parish Assembly. <u>The King's Coronation</u>: Is anyone in the community thinking about planning a Street Party for the Coronation?

<u>Village Hall Chelmer Room Flood</u>: This occurred just before Christmas. Ash Waste quoted $\pounds 1,000 + VAT$ for a new pump. The quote to clean the carpet was $\pounds 100$.

<u>Village Hall Benches</u>: There is a new policy for memorial benches on the sports ground whereby if they deteriorate the owners will be notified and given a period of time to carry out repairs before the bench is removed.

<u>Village Hall Committee Members</u>: Michael Scott has taken on the maintenance role of meeting trades people and allowing them access to the hall; Lorna Cannon has taken over the role of Secretary; Lynn Cameron will stay a while longer as Bookings Secretary.



Jobs for this month include sowing seeds in greenhouses or windowsills, hardy annuals can be sown directly outside, finish pruning roses to increase summer flowering, pick off developing seed heads on daffodils and other spring bulbs, leave the foliage to die back naturally, feed ericaceous shrubs, such as rhododendrons, azaleas and camellias, put bug boxes in sheltered areas of the garden and keep feeding the garden birds as the breeding season starts. MARGARETTING CofE PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

Mrs Melissa Taylor (Headteacher) writes: It has been a busy start to the Spring Term and the children have all been working hard. There have been some real highlights in our learning this half term. EYFS children made gingerbread people and houses as part of their learning on fairy tales; Year 1/2 children made a boat and have enjoyed experimenting with paints as part of their 'All Things Bright and Beautiful' topic; Year 3/4 have been making stone age jewellery due to them learning about the prehistoric world; and Year 5/6 have drawn themselves falling through space as part of their learning in this area of science.

The Year 5/6 children took park in a music project, set by the English National Opera. The children were tasked with finishing a competition called 'Blue, Red Yellow...' They chose black as the fourth colour. The children worked collaboratively as a team to understand how to make sounds relating to our colour and used pitched and unpitched instruments for our final piece. I am delighted to announce that we came in the top 45 out of 200 schools! Which is a fantastic achievement - well done to Miss O'Toole and the children.

We are still working hard to exercise for 1,000,000 miles before September. We are currently at 8009 for our school and the Trust total is 265,684, which is 26.5% of our total target. Come on everyone – I know you can do it! It has been great to see the children competing in sports events and competitions

this term, such as boccia and multisport – these are all helping towards our 1,000,000 target.

We have also had Ofsted this half term. Once the final report is published, it will be available on our website. Thank you to all staff and pupils for their hard work everyday and during the inspection. I look forward to sharing the final outcome. On 2^{nd} March, we are looking forward to celebrating World Book Day.

The children and staff will be coming to school dressed as their favourite book characters and we will be celebrating different books. We are also looking to raise funds to pay for new phonics books in EYFS. We have currently raised $\pounds 500$ and need $\pounds 1000$.

In March, we are also looking forward to our PTFA Easter Egg hunt and our Easter Service led by Reverend Sally and Cannon Lee.

VILLAGE RECOLLECTIONS

Robert Fletcher, in response to last month's recollections, which included the information about the Sawyer family being local bakers, shares this information about two Margaretting WW1 casualties:

SAWYER FAMILY: "I looked at Frank Sawyer, the 1919 WW1 casualty at Margaretting Churchyard in 2021 in relation to Herbert Beer. I obtained a copy of his death certificate (March 1919). Poor Frank died as a result of a wound to his abdomen in 1917 at Fort Pitt, Kent. Interestingly, the certificate gives his occupation pre-war as "Baker". So that is the connection with the Sawyer family as Bakers you mention. Fort Pitt was an old Victorian fort converted to a hospital and then a mental hospital, until it was closed in the 1920s." BEER FAMILY: 'I looked at Herbert Beer back in 2021 as I saw Margaretting was going to amend the War Memorial to add names from both World Wars who had been omitted. I do not think Herbert was on this list and I wondered why. He has a Commonwealth War Graves entry and is a legitimate casualty. Please make sure Herbert Beer is put on the war memorial."

NB: The parish council has included Herbert Beer's name to the list of missing names to be added to the war memorial and it is currently checking out recommended stonemasons with the War Memorials Trust.

Herbert Beer died in Denes Hospital, South Shields on 13th January 1919. He was a Private in the 3rd Durham Light Infantry. His death certificate gives his address as Halls Cottages, Margaretting and occupation pre-war as Timber Hauler

Voter ID Requirement

From 4 May 2023, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at Polling Stations. From October 2023 it will apply to UK General Elections. <u>This will apply to</u>: Local Elections; Police and Crime Commissioner elections; UK parliamentary by-elections; Recall petitions <u>Accepted forms of ID</u> Passport issued by the UK Driving Licence issued by the UK Blue Badge; Older persons bus pass Disabled persons bus pass Oyster 60 + Card

Voting by post

You don't need photo ID.

Out of Date Photo ID You can still use your photo ID if it's out of date as long as it looks like you. The name on your ID should be the same name you need to register to vote.

If you don't have accepted photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate. The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate for the local elections in England on 4 May 2023 is 5pm on Tuesday 25 April 2023. <u>Get help with electoral registration</u> Chelmsford City Council
