### **Funeral Service** Patricia Ann Taylor (26.3.1942 - 5.1.2025)

Patricia's funeral was held at St Margaret's church on Tuesday, 4th February. The service was led by Reverend Canon Lee Francis-Dehqani. The organist/pianist was Claire Renowden. The family's chosen hymns were 'Morning Has Broken' and 'The Lord's My Shepherd'. The mourners entered the church to the sound of five half muffled bells. A single tenor bell was rung after the service as the family followed the casket to the grave. The church was beautifully decorated with pink roses and carnations in honour of Patricia who, when a member of the church flower team, always decorated the pillars. Patricia's daughter Penny read a poem 'My Mum' which she had written as a personal tribute to Patricia. Nick, on behalf of the family, shared the Taylor family's treasured memories with relatives, friends and neighbours. He mentioned Patricia's love of travel, art, orchids and the

many lifelong friends she made in Margaretting through her involvement with village events, which included flower arranging and bell ringing in the church and litter picking in the village. Patricia had lived in the village for 44 years and was well known for her flower and produce entries in the Margaretting Horticultural Show where over the years she won many prizes and cups. Our thoughts are with her husband Harold, her children Nick, Tim and Penny, grandchildren, family and friends.

Village Hall. The Black Bull donation plus the extra raffle prizes donated by The Star increased the amount raised by the Race Night to £2,592. Talks are taking place with the school about using the field for nature work, sports day and lunchtime breaks in the summer. Permission has been granted to trim the TPO trees.

### Maldon Road Playing Field.

Climbing Frame - gaps appearing between the safety surface and the edging will be filled with topsoil.

Trees - the branches overhanging the Broadoaks annexe can be cut back and removed by the parishioner. Access through

### Main Road.

National Speed Limit Sign - the sign knocked down opposite Bishops Court has been reported (Ref. 2955845). War Memorial - The unnamed soldier is to remain there. Red telephone box by the pond - Cllr Bonnett to inform the City Council that the parish council is happy to have the equipment removed and the phone box secured.

Webbs Cottage - Nothing to report about rubbish being dumped on the property's adjacent land. This issue has been raised with the Black Bull.

### Maldon Road.

Dumped furniture - partially obstructing the pavement outside a property in Maldon Road has been reported to Chelmer Housing Partnership. (Ref 72/204402/WAIEJF) Potholes - Clerk to report the surface water by El-Rita. The large pothole between Whitesbridge Farm and the bridge has been reported. (Ref 3782456).

The Tye. The dog fouling bin at The White Hart seems to be periodically missed off the City Council emptying rota. This issue has been reported. (Ref. RFSS 54279).

**Grass Cutting.** MD Landscapes has closed. This company will no longer be cutting the grass around the village.

City Council. Cllr Bonnett reported on increases in car parking tariffs, burial and cremation fees, brown bin emptying charges. Councillors expressed an interest to learn how much money had been raised at Hylands Park through the parking fees. Freedom of Information (Ref IR12171)

### Margaretting Horticultural Village Fête - Saturday 12th July 2025 – 12:30pm - 4:30pm

March brings the expectation of warmer weather. Bright arrays of springtime flowering bulbs and blossom on the trees. While the sun's rays are gaining in strength, there is a chance of late frosts.

This month, sow seeds in greenhouses or on windowsills. Sow hardy annuals outside, finish pruning roses to boost summer blooms, remove seed heads from daffodils and other spring bulbs, allow foliage to die back naturally, feed ericaceous shrubs, place bug boxes in sheltered garden areas, and continue feeding garden birds as breeding season begins.

With the arrival of April showers and increased daylight, the growing season is progressing well, although there remains a possibility of a late frost. Indoor-sown seeds will be developing nicely, and now is the time to directly sow hardy annual seeds outside into gaps in your borders. For instant colour, consider planting primulas and polyanthus. Other tasks for this month include deadheading spring bulbs to conserve their energy for the following year, pruning hydrangeas by cutting back old stems to healthy growth, and sowing sunflowers in sunny positions for late summer colour.

For vegetable gardening, sow second early and main crop potatoes, and plant outdoor varieties of tomatoes, chillies, and courgettes into pots, which will be ready for planting out in May or June. It is also essential to keep emerging weeds under control. Increase the water given to houseplants and feed hungry shrubs and roses to support their new growth. Additionally, this is an opportune time to sow new lawns or repair bare patches.

This year, we are pleased to announce the show will open with the School Choir, entertainment will continue with The Silver Gem Majorettes, inflatable Bungee Run suitable for all ages and more yet to be confirmed. There will be a variety of exquisite, handcrafted stalls, high-quality homemade products, barbecue, bar, music, refreshments, exhibitions and traditional favourites too.

The three books we have read since Christmas are 'The Crooked House' by Agatha Christie, 'The Poisonwood Bible' by Barbara Kingswood' and 'Behind The Scenes At The Museum' by Kate Atkinson.

'The Crooked House' by Agatha Christie was first published in March 1949. The action takes place in and near London in the autumn of 1947. We found it enjoyable as a period piece, as a murder mystery and a character study.

'Behind The Scenes At The Museum' is Kate Atkinson's debut novel published in 1995. We really enjoyed reading this book. It is a tale of four generations of women in a Yorkshire family spanning the twentieth century.

'The Poisonwood Bible' published in 1998 proved to be challenging and at times provocative and a depressing read. It is a long novel (614 pages) about The Price family, a missionary family who in 1959 moved from Georgia in the USA to the village of Kilanga in the Belgian Congo. The story explores freedom, women and sexism, religion and faith, growth and coming-of-age through the eyes of the wife and four daughters of Nathan Price, a fierce evangelical Baptist. We are currently reading 'Perfume, The Story of a Murderer' by Patrick Suskind.
