REVD FRANCES DRAKE

The news of Revd. Frances's death on 2nd January came as a shock to many in the village. Many will remember her enthusiasm, zest for life and love of people. Nothing ever seemed to faze her.

Frances was the first appointment of a woman member of the clergy for our three parishes. Her great sense of fun, strong faith and her beautiful singing voice will be especially remembered by members of St Margaret's congregation. Frances's funeral was held on Saturday, 24th January in St Thomas's Church Navestock. In line with Frances's wishes the service, led by Cannon John Brown, was a celebration of her life - it was a truly fitting tribute to all her achievements.

MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JANUARY & FEBRUARY MEETINGS

DEMOCRATIC TIME

No issues were raised.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

We agreed to support a village event in May - Saturday, 16th May. This event will include art and photographic displays as well as games, craft stalls and workshops.

YOUTH COUNCILS

Miss Jordanne Wood, vice chairman of Ingatestone and Fryerning Youth Council had been invited to attend the meeting to speak about the work of the youth councils. Jordanne, who is Head Girl at the Anglo European School, joined the Ingatestone & Fryerning Youth Council a year ago. She is one of thirteen 11-18 year olds who make up the membership of the council.

Jordanne explained Ingatestone & Fryerning Youth Council's remit includes the parish of Margaretting. She described the areas of work the youth council gets involved with and how its members are able to offer help for local projects and events. We confirmed we would welcome the youth council's support and its ideas for the Margaretting community event planned in May.

It was agreed that Jordanne would write a piece for the newsletter to try and encourage new members to the youth council as ten of its members would be leaving to go to university this year.

FLOOD ALLEVIATION SCHEME

Land negotiations continue between the Environment Agency and Mr Sharp.

ALLOTMENTS & PLAY AREA

No reported incidents.

REPAIRS & MAINTENANCE

Nothing to report.

VILLAGE ROADS, PAVEMENTS AND RIGHTS OF WAY

Penny's Lane: The potholes have been repaired. The ongoing school parking problem is being dealt with by the school management.

Maldon Road - kerb defects: The kerb outside Nos 1a and 1b has been inspected and is awaiting repairs.

Maldon Road - Street lights: Defect to Post No 17 has been reported.

Maldon Road - Nuns Crossing: Network Rail has inspected the area and will be instructing its contractors to carry out the following works which it believes will solve the flooding problem.

1. Regrade the slope at the access gate to the yard to direct run off straight to the existing pipe in the ditch.
2. Remove vegetation from the area around the pipe in the ditch.
3. Sluice out existing road drain to ensure it is running smoothly.

Footpaths: The bollard for footpath 43 has been put back but not satisfactory. We agreed to organise a survey of Margaretting's 'rights of way'. The last one took place several years ago. Information on how local residents can take part in the survey will be published in the newsletter.

Three Mile Hill - shed occupancy: The shed constructed within woodland area between A414 and A12 at Street Record Three Mile Hill Intersection 4 is occupied by a 'homeless gentleman'. Chelmsford City Council has requested the occupant remove the shed and cease occupying the land. It has also requested the Highways Authority to take steps to ensure his removal

VILLAGE POND AND TREES

We agreed that before work can be carried out to the dead tree by the pond confirmation is required from BT on how much it would charge to survey, disconnect and re-connect the telephone line.

We have received our replacement millennium oak tree and have been given two additional oak trees. **See next page.**

ACCOUNTS

Expenditure agreed:

ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL SURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT

ECC has requested details of local problem areas, that is, locations that could be at risk from flooding. These locations could be where homes have actually been flooded, have a history of flooding or areas viewed as presenting a risk of flooding to homes in the future. Details forwarded to ECC include the properties in Main Road (Red Lion, the school and Brookside).

ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL QUIETER LANES PROPOSAL

A major initiative aimed at making country lanes safer and calmer by turning them into 'Quiet Lanes' is being adopted by Essex County Council. Although cars would not be banned, Quiet Lanes will encourage traffic to proceed cautiously.

ECC will initially ask each of the county's 12 Local Highways Panels to identify two roads to be considered as Quiet Lanes. The nominated roads would continue to receive a basic level of maintenance but the route's status change would help calm the traffic. HGVs would be banned and a 20mph limit would be implemented as standard practice.

We agreed the two lanes in Margaretting which would benefit from the quieter status would be Swan Lane and Ivy Barn Lane.
