MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JANUARY 2020 MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Five members of the public present. The following matters were brought to the attention of the parish council. Parsonage Lane - water leak in field. The pipe is still leaking and the track is in poor condition. Cllr Blurton will look at the Land Registry map to see who owns the different pieces of land. War Memorial - missing names. Mr David Frost (St Margaret's PCC) presented a short report on the four names missing from the war memorial. He suggested there may have been a logical reason why these names had not been included. Cllr Paoli-Burke and Lorna Cannon volunteered to help place in the area. It was agreed this Mr Frost with his research. Cllr Blurton thought the easiest way to accommodate extra names on the war memorial would be to fix two separate plaques to the memorial plinth. Black Bull - community asset. The Parish Council unanimously agreed to apply for an 'Assets of

Community Value' to be placed on The Black Bull. Mr Frost explained the nomination/application process for Cllr Wallace undertook to remove the registering the Black Bull as a community asset. He suggested the parish council complete an application form as a matter of urgency. Cllr Blurton will circulate the form to councillors for comment. He will consult J Bennett (Black Bull), P Savill (PCC) and M Scott (Village Hall Committee).

Chelmsford City Council will no longer be supplying residents with additional rolls of plastics sacks for recycling. <u>Chelmsford City Council will continue to</u> <u>deliver a roll of plastic sacks to each household in</u> <u>Chelmsford once a year</u>, and encourage residents to maximise the space in each sack by remembering, "wash the bottle, squash the bottle and put the lid back on" to expel the air. Additionally, Chelmsford City Council is aware that some of the recycling sacks are used for unintended purposes, so it aims to stop that too. It will also no longer be providing plastic dog waste bags.
