MARGARETTING RELIEF IN NEED TRUST

The Trust was created in 1975 after the sale of the former alms houses (now The Square). No. 1 Whites Cottage was later acquired and refurbished to provide two self-contained flats, rented by two people from village families of long standing. In the late 1990s the Trust separately formed the Margaretting Community Fund under the umbrella of the Essex Community Foundation. Since then, our Foundation fund has provided many grants to groups within the Chelmsford area in addition to those made by the Trust's own fund. The weekly bus provided by the Trust, which runs on Fridays to Ingatestone and Tesco, continues to be well used.

Trustees meet regularly and have a wide area of reference when dealing with cases of genuine need, which is not limited to the elderly. For example, the Trust has recently offered financial support to a local student to help with travel costs to a further education college in Chelmsford. VILLAGE HALL

Received a report on various financial issues currently being discussed by the hall committee. These included checking out the electrics in the Chelmer Room and replacing the carpet. Also, replacing the double doors and the water tanks.

ACCOUNTS

Expenditure agreed this month: £1,236 - BHIB (annual insurance) £491- MDL (grass cutting)

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

<u>Dog Fouling</u>: To date there has been no response to our request to the dog warden for assistance to tackle the dog fouling problem. It was agreed to look into fixing a new dog fouling warning sign on the entrance gates. A sign to point out that the field is a priority play space for children and for dog owners to pick up after their dogs.

<u>Trees to the rear of Broad Oaks</u>: The required number of quotes have been received for the removal of these trees. An order will be placed for the work next month.

<u>Play safety surfaces</u>: The area where the safety surface has shrunk is to be filled with sharp sand. It was noted filling the area with earth did not work. <u>Activities</u>: It was suggested if other activities were offered, e.g. table tennis, more people would use and respect the area. Further discussion was deferred to the June meeting.

MAIN ROAD

<u>War memorial</u>: The weeping pear trees will be pruned later in the year. <u>Garden fence</u>: An enforcement notice, to remove the fence adjacent to the bus shelter opposite the Black Bull, has been issued by Chelmsford Council. <u>Redundant petrol filling station</u>: The Clerk has requested an update on any enforcement notices issued for the use of this site.

PARSONAGE LANE

<u>Fences</u>: Some of the fences have encroached on Highways land. Highways has asked for the parish council's view on having the fences moved back two metres. <u>Road under the railway bridge</u>: It was noted the stretch of road between the bridge and Tyelands is owned by the Environment Agency. Requests made to the Environment Agency to repair this stretch of road have failed.

WANTZ ROAD

<u>Parking problems</u>: Photographs showing the number of cars parked in the road, either side of the entrance to the village hall, are to be sent to Highways with the parish council's request for a junction protection order.

Damaged verge at the top of the slip road to A12: Still no response from Highways England as to when it will repair the damage caused by its contractors.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

It was suggested the parish council could become a bit more involved in things such as clearing footpaths and cycle paths.

ST MARGARET'S CHURCH NEWS - ASSOCIATE PRIEST VACANCY

A meeting was held in St Giles' church Mountnessing on Wednesday16 May to discuss filling the above vacancy. Archdeacon Elizabeth outlined the situation to the members of the Parochial Church Councils from the five churches (Ingatestone, Fryerning, Margaretting, Mountnessing and Buttsbury) with a PowerPoint presentation.

The full presentation is available if you would like to see paper copies of the slides.

Those present were tasked to consider the key questions and priorities listed below and for all PCC members to come back for another meeting with Archdeacon Elizabeth.

What kind of ministry do we need?

- For all the five churches or for the two and the three?
- Type of ministry House for Duty or Self Supporting Ministry?
- How do we finance the ministry? All the parishes are struggling to pay the parish share needed to sustain the ministry in the present structure.

- How does all this fit in with the Brentwood Deanery plan for clergy numbers?
 - A House for Duty fits the plan.
- How will it fit in at a later date with Mission and Ministry units?

A House for duty post would be Sunday and two days a week, or equivalent through part days.

We are asked to consider the priorities from the list below. Considering the time constraint, two or three should be selected.

- 1. Leading worship
- 2. Christian festivals
- 3. Occasional offices (baptisms, funerals, weddings)
- 4. School's ministry
- 5. Leadership of PCCs
- 6. Discipleship
- 7. Mission in the parishes
- 8. Buildings.

ST MARGARET'S CHURCH SUPPORT GROUP

There have been a few negative comments about the state of the church yard recently. Please be assured that work is in hand to cut the grass back to a manageable length. However, a small section where there are no graves, will be left uncut. The aim will be to cut this section once or twice a year to allow the wild flowers to flourish.

As mentioned many times before the church finances are not at all healthy which means the PCC (Parochial Church Council) is having to rely more and more on the Support Group volunteers to help keep the church yard tidy and the church building in good repair.

Currently the PCC pays for all the grass at the front of the church to be cut regularly as well as a large part of the grass at the back of the church. The parish council contributes £600 a year towards these costs. The rest has to be met out of dwindling church funds. This year the Church Support Group Committee agreed to give a one-off £250 contribution towards the grass cutting costs. This contribution will come from the group's fund raising events.

Do come along to one of these events and show your support for your parish church. Our next fund raising event will take place on Saturday, 7 July. Song Cycle will be performing in the church at 7.30pm.
