MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - FEBRUARY MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

One member of the public present. Issues raised included:

Cycling clubs treating Maldon Road like a race track. We advised residents to inform us when a club uses this road in an unacceptable or dangerous way so that we can complain directly to the club's officials.

Loud noises from the train whistles as they pass Footpath 21. These can be heard first thing in the morning and late at night. We agreed to contact Network Rail to remind them that train whistles should not be sounded during the hours of darkness. We agreed also, now that procedures are in hand to close Footpath 21, to ask Network Rail when it is going to remove the whistle board.

MARGARETTING 2015

We discussed arrangements for the 16th May village event. There will be art and photographic displays, craft stalls, sporting activities and afternoon tea.

FLOOD ALLEVIATION SCHEME

Nothing further to report except the negotiations to gain access to land at The Tye continue.

REPAIRS & MAINTENANCE

War Memorial: We received confirmation from Moody Homes that the estimate for repairing the damage to the bollards caused by one of their vans in May 2013 has been forwarded to the insurers of the third party car involved in the incident.

VILLAGE ROADS, PAVEMENTS AND RIGHTS OF WAY

Main Road: The Police, in response to school parents' concerns about speeding traffic, will be conducting speed checks in the vicinity of the Red Lion. We agreed to contact the local Highways Panel to find out when we can expect to see the speed limit reduced to 30mph.

The address for the three new houses nearing completion opposite Larmars Engineering will be Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Spreadeagle Place, Main Road. Pennys Lane: The Police have been informed about the inconsiderate parking outside the school. The owners of the cars parking on the yellow lines can expect to receive warning letters.

Parsonage Lane: Complaints about the poor state of the grass verge due to cars and vans continually being parked on the verge have been reported to the Chelmer Housing Partnership and Chelmsford City Council's Planning Enforcement Team. Concerns were also expressed at the increasing numbers of cars and lorries using Parsonage Lane. Maldon Road: Details of cars and vans parking on the double yellow lines are to be forwarded to our PCSO. The faintness of the double yellow lines outside 1a and 1b is to be reported to Chelmsford City Council. A site meeting is to take place with the Watercourse Regulation Engineer to discuss the flooding issues in Maldon Road. Concerns were expressed about wheelie bins, in readiness for collection, being left over night on the pavement in hazardous positions. See back page.

Three Mile Hill: The Highways Authority are pursuing the removal of the unauthorized shed; the file is to remain open to enable Chelmsford City Council Expenditure agreed this month: to monitor the situation.

Footpath No. 33: We received a report from a local walker that the official footpath notice has a redirection arrow pointing away from the footpath. We agreed to inform the land owner.

Margaretting/Writtle Road: Comments were made that the newly installed gate on the verge with Writtle on one side and Margaretting on the other is not the actual boundary for the two parishes. We agreed to contact Writtle PC for more information.

VILLAGE POND AND TREES

We agreed to offer the two new millennium oak trees to a local land owner so that the trees can be planted on land with a public right of way.

ALLOTMENTS & PLAY AREA

No reported incidents. We received two quotations for the purchase and installation of toddler swings. A decision will be made once a third quote is received.

FINANCIAL REGULATIONS

We reviewed and updated 'Margaretting Parish Council's Financial Regulations' to reflect the amendments made to the National Association of Local Council's (NALC) model financial regulations. Margaretting Parish Council's Standing Orders will be reviewed at a later date.

The date for this year's spring clean is Saturday 11th April.

ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL **OUIETER LANES PROPOSAL**

We are still waiting to learn more about this proposal and to hear if we will be asked to nominate two lanes for the quieter lane status. A local resident, in response to last month's discussions, has expressed the view that Ivy Barn Lane would not benefit from the quieter status due to it being the main route west from the A12, for all traffic, whether HGV, or as now, LGV. It has also been pointed out that there are three Goods Vehicle Operators licences, or more, registered in this road which renders banning of HGVs impossible.


BOGUS CALLERS
