Items discussed at February's parish council meeting

DEMOCRATIC TIME: A Galleywood parishioner, who is interested in buying The Oaks, Wantz Road, outlined ideas he had for the property and its past planning history. The parish council advised him on what was allowed within planning rules. **LOCAL HIGHWAYS PANEL:** The request for a new sign

LOCAL HIGHWAYS PANEL: The request for a new sign for the school has been accepted (sign to be erected approaching the school from the Ingatestone direction). The application to join the cycle paths from Indian Nights (Widford) and the path from Webbs Farm golf course is being explored.

OPERATION LONDON BRIDGE: Ingatestone parish council is to be asked if Margaretting residents would be allowed to sign Ingatestone's 'Book of Remembrance'.

MALDON ROAD ALLOTMENTS: Allotment holders to be consulted on which allotments should be cleared.

Clearance work to be carried out on the weekend of 12th and 13th March.

QUEENS JUBILEE CELEBRATION: It will be a free event and not exclusively for Margaretting residents; it will include neighbouring villagers and families. The marquee hire and some caterers are already booked. The parish council will support the event with a £2,800 budget - any funds left over will go back to the parish council.

VILLAGE TREES: There is a five year maintenance agreement in place for the Weeping Pears (War Memorial). Permission is needed from Chelmsford City Council for any work done on the Willow (The Tye).

MARGARETTING FUN DAY AND HORTICULTURAL SHOW



Another month closer to our first show in two years and the plans are all coming together nicely.

We hope to have a crockery smash stall, so if you have any old crockery that you no longer need, we would love some donations. Then we can have a smashing time on the day! Please do get in touch and we can arrange collection.

Some gardening tips for the month ahead: sow aubergines, tomatoes, celeriac, squash, pumpkins, marrows and leeks undercover. Beetroot, carrots and peas can be sown directly into prepared ground. Chitted potatoes can be planted in the next couple of weeks. Thin out seedlings. Sow hardy annuals such as love-in-the-mist and pot marigolds, sweet peas or sunflowers (protect from slugs and snails). As the weather warms up look out for aphids too. Re-invigorate your hardy perennials by dividing the mature clumps and re-planting. Dead head spring bulbs so energy is not lost in making seeds but creating stronger bulbs for next year. Their leaves can be cut back in a few week's when they start to die back.

LEVEL CROSSING CLOSURES AND EXTINGUISHMENT OF PUBLIC FOOTPATHS

Network Rail's proposals, to close two level crossings and connected public footpaths in Margaretting, as set out in The that E15 Parsonage Lane carries a local access road Network Rail (Essex and Others Level Crossing Reduction) Order ("the Order"), to be made under sections 1 and 5 of the Transport and Works Act 1992 has received the Secretary of State's approval.

E16 Maldon Road: The Secretary of State notes that E16 Maldon Road carries public footpath EX/226/21 over the railway and has been temporarily closed since 2013 due to insufficient sighting. The Order would confer powers to close the crossing to all users to extinguish the whole of footpath EX/226/21 which runs over it, and to construct a new diversionary public bridleway. Users would be diverted to the south over this bridleway, along the footway of Maldon Road, and then on to the B1002.

COMMITTEE SECRETARY

JUMBLE SALE

Margaretting Friends would like to thank everyone who supported this fundraising event by donating jumble, giving a financial donation and helping on the day. A total of £282 was raised in aid of the village hall.

E15 Parsonage Lane;: The Secretary of State notes over the railway connecting the road network to a group of properties and providing onward connectivity to the footpath network. The Order would confer powers to extinguish all public rights of way over the crossing but would retain private access rights. Existing foot users would be diverted along an existing footpath through a vehicular underpass.

The Secretary of State notes that all three objectors to this proposal raised concerns that the locking of the vehicular crossing gates would impede vehicle access to their properties including emergency vehicles. The Secretary of State notes that, in response to these concerns, Network Rail has committed not to lock the vehicular crossing gates, which the Inspector considers addresses these concerns. The Secretary of State notes that the Environment Agency had anticipated that E15 would be used as part of the construction and access routes to the proposed Chelmsford Flood Alleviation Scheme as heavy goods vehicles will be required to carry material and machinery to site. The Secretary of State further notes the Inspector's view that, should the Environment Agency seek to use E15 as part of any future flood defence works, access over it would be a matter to be negotiated with Network Rail.
