#### MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JULY MEETING

#### FLOOD ALLEVIATION SCHEME

The Environment Agency and Chelmsford City Council have responded to our request for an update on the scheme. Although the scheme has been subject to a number of objections which have resulted in a delay to implementing the works it still remains the E.A.'s intention to commence the works this year. As well as trying to resolve outstanding complex and sensitive landowner issues the E.A. has been discussing the construction of the works with its suppliers. These discussions, which form part of the process to achieve value for money, are proving to be fairly lengthy. The E.A. is currently confirming its budgets and approvals to proceed with the works later this year.

#### SKATE BOARD RAMPS

From previous correspondence with Chelmsford Council about the young people's request to install ramps it would appear there would be no objections to installing additional equipment in the playing field. Skate board ramps, however, may be subject to planning permissions.

Our new councillor, Andy Wallace, has agreed to take the lead on this project.

#### VILLAGE PROJECTS

Lavender Bank: Nothing further to report. Thanks were expressed to Margaretting Friends for caring for this bank. Village Hall Road Sign: The confusion surrounding our request to install a road sign at the cross roads has been sorted out. We are now waiting for ECC Highways' formal consent. Parish Council Office: The signal strength for the internet in the new office is very weak. Advice is needed on how to resolve this. Margaretting Friends have donated £25 towards the costs of buying some planters to place between the bollards on the ramp. Village Gateways: We agreed to forward our proposal to the Local Highways Panel for consideration as a scheme to receive ECC funding. Whites Bridge Walk Boards: Plans for replacing the boards are in hand. ECC has agreed to undertake the work. ALLOTMENTS & PLAY AREA

No reported incidents since the last meeting. All the allotments are taken. Arrangements are in hand to obtain the required number of quotations to reduce the height of some of the trees growing along the playing field boundary.

#### VILLAGE POND AND TREES

The Conservation Volunteers have expressed an interest in clearing the pond. Quotations are being sought to remove the Grant Planning Permission dead tree by the pond. We have applied for a grant to help offset the cost of an oak Concerns were expressed about excesto replace the dead millennium oak

#### **DOG WASTE BINS**

The site for the bin in Parsonage Lane has been agreed. We have yet to reach a decision on a bin for Orton Close.

#### GRASS VERGES

The parish council is delighted to let everyone know that the village received a Merit Award in the Best Kept Village 2014 Competition. Thank you to everyone in the community for your support and help in keeping the village litter free and looking attractive.

#### **VILLAGE GRASS VERGES**

Who maintains the village verges? This is a question frequently asked of the parish council. The answer, depending on the verge in question, can be any one of the following: local residents, the Parish Council, Chelmer Housing Partnership, Chelmsford City Council or Essex County Council.

Maintenance of the verge in Main Road abutting Peacocks is the responsibility of ECC. In past years it has been cut twice a year by ECC contractors. Residents who complained about this verge thought it looked neglected; an overgrown mess that prevented motorists from having a good line of sight and pedestrians from being able to walk safely along a busy main road. The parish council is in contact with ECC to establish what maintenance if any is being planned for this particular verge next year. Meanwhile, a significant length of the verge has now been cut by a local resident.

The parish council is aware of the differing views held in the village about how often the verges should be cut. There are some who do not agree with grass verges being cut regularly. They prefer to see the wild grasses and flowers growing freely. They feel this is in keeping with our rural setting and provides a natural habitat for wild life. The parish council is aware also of the campaign by 'plantlife' urging local councils to cut verges twice a year only.

#### MARGARETTING FAMILY FUN DAY 2014

Margaretting had never seen so many people until this year's family fun day on Saturday the 12<sup>th</sup> of July. Over 400 adults plus their children attended, with this year's event being the first to advertise online! The field was filled with everything from market stalls and classic cars to bouncy castles and face painting, all run by local volunteers too. The arena hosted maypole dancing, a tug of war tournament and live music from local band, 'Best Served Cold',

not to mention the superb gymnastics performance by the Blue Falcons display team. The bar and BBQ were huge successes and sold out of almost everything with thanks to the Black Bull Pub and if the 25°c heat wasn't enough to light up the weekend, the RAF fly-past with its two spitfires certainly was!





On a negative note, the hall was nowhere near as full of horticultural entries as usual with the flower classes left bare!
