MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JUNE MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Three members of the public present. The issues raised and discussed were:

- (i) Flood Alleviation Scheme Update Chelmsford City Council confirmed it has nothing further to report.
- (ii) Parsonage Lane Public Footpath The parish council reported it had received no paper work for September's meeting with Network Rail concerning the proposed closure of the railway crossing footpath.
- (iii) Parsonage Lane Poor state of track under railway bridge. Residents reported they are now repairing some of this track themselves as it is in such a bad state.
- (iv) War Memorial Flags. Mr Maurice Wright's offer to resume responsibility as the Village Flag Master was accepted.

VILLAGE HALL

The parish council noted the various repairs which need attention. The village hall committee will see if there are any available grants to help offset the costs of these repairs.

VILLAGE GATEWAYS

The four gateways are now in place.

PUBLIC FOOTPATHS

Footpath 39 needs clearing - this will be reported to Essex Highways.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

Activities: The parish council is waiting to receive information about table tennis.

Playground Inspection: ROSPA's inspection report was discussed. It was agreed to seek quotes to re-paint the junior swings and to re-stain the gates.

Allotments: It was agreed a note would be sent to the allotment holders reminding them that their allotments should be kept tidy.

Trees to the rear of Broad Oaks: The tree work will start mid June.

MALDON ROAD

Surface Water: An assessment inspection has been completed. A drainage engineer will review the findings.

MAIN ROAD

Village Pond: A project to improve the water quality, the path and to repair the dipping platform was discussed. Cllrs Banks, Wallace and Blurton agreed to lead on this project.

Removal of the fence opposite the Black £439- MDL (grass cutting) Bull: It was noted six months had passed since an enforcement notice was issued. It was not known whether there has been an appeal.

WANTZ ROAD

Parking problems: The parking has improved slightly since the residents have written to the businesses opposite Wantfield Cottages. It was agreed the parish council would report the parking problem to Safer Essex Road Partnership. Damaged verge at the top of the A12 slip road - London direction: The parish council is still waiting for a response from Highways England to confirm when it will repair the damage caused by its contractors. It was agreed to rereport the damage.

Overgrown verges - the A12 slip road by the Ivy Hill Hotel: It was reported due to the overgrown verges motorists turning right into Ivy Barn Lane are finding it difficult to see the traffic coming off the A12. The parish council agreed to put in a request to Essex Highways for the verges to be cut back.

MARGARETTING TYE

Green adjacent to The White Hart: The landlord of the White Hart has asked if he could install bollards to prevent motorists from parking on the green. It was noted permission would be needed from Lord Petre and Essex Highways.

<u>Heavy Lorries</u>: Heavy lorries are using Swan Lane to access Fristling Hall, Stock. It was queried whether there is a weight restriction on the grade II listed Whites Bridge.

ACCOUNTS

Expenditure agreed this month: £97 - ROSPA (annual inspection) £120 - Village Hall (Eastern Angles)

PLANNING

Two applications were received for comment.

18/00919/FUL - Ivy Hill Hotel. Proposed extension to existing outbuildings and conversion into 2 staff accommodation apartments.

18/009966/FUL - Whites Place Farm (Ingatestone Saddlery).

Proposed horticultural facilities.

The following decision was noted. 18/00480/FUL - Edmount, The Tye. Planning permission granted.

It was noted an enforcement notice had been served on Barns House. Main Road.

AOB ITEMS

Recycling query. Recycling bags are delivered to households twice a year. Alternatively, bags can be collected from the village hall on certain dates. A12 road repairs query. It was agreed to find out when these repairs are due to be completed.

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH - BREAKING NEWS!

Members of the parish council recognise excess speed in Main Road is an important issue for the local community and at their July meeting they discussed forming a community speed watch group.

Community Speed Watch is a locally driven initiative where active members of the **community** join together with the support of the Police to monitor speeds of vehicles using speed detection devices. More than 85 community speed watch groups are now operating across the Essex Police area, providing regular monitoring of vehicle speeds within their own locations.

This initiative will rely heavily on volunteers and the parish council will need to know it has enough volunteers who are willing and able to join a community speed watch group.

Monitoring of speeds are undertaken by pairs of volunteers in reflective 'Community Speedwatch' jackets supported by advance warning signs. Results are forwarded via log sheets to The Casualty Reduction Unit for processing, and warning letters are sent to the registered keepers of the vehicles monitored travelling in excess of the posted speed limit.

First–time offenders will be sent warning letters by the Police, second and subsequent offences will lead to Police action.
