# **REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 2021**

The ceremony and prayers were led by Lay Minister, Tim Lee. Bugler Jonathan Steer played 'The Last Post' and 'Reveille'. This year was Jonathan's twenty ninth year playing for Margaretting's Act of Remembrance.

Wreaths were laid at the foot of the war memorial by representatives of the Parish Council, St Margaret's Church Support Group, Margaretting Friends and the CAMEO Club. Margaretting School's wreath was laid at the war memorial by the school community on Thursday, 11th November.

Lee Jones, representing the community, recited the well known verse from 'For the Fallen' a poem by Robert Laurence Binyon (1869-1943), published in The Times on 21 September 1914.

They shall not grow old as we that are left grow old Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them

The following have been discussed and noted since the last newsletter:

Maldon Road Playing Field - Repairs to the allotment gate and how best to clear the first two overgrown allotments.
