In loving memory

Peter Roy Hasler, aged 86. Peter lived in Margaretting Hall Cottages. He spent nearly all his life in Margaretting, and worked for the Currie family at Brook Farm for 53 years. He drove the combine harvester, cut hedges, hoed the sugar beet and later became gamekeeper as well.

Peter and May were together for more than 60 years. He loved his children Linda, Susan, Pauline, Philip and Heather, and was a much loved granddad to 37 grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Peter was a real countryman - he loved the outdoors life, pigeon shooting, ferreting, growing vegetables in his garden, and in later years, metal detecting. He also cut the grass for Margaretting church for many years. He was a peaceful man, much loved, content with life and always ready to help others.

At his funeral members of his family enjoyed listening to "Amazing Grace", "Granddad We Love You" and "Unchained Melody". He was buried in the churchyard close to many other members of the Hasler family.

Eve Valerie Wheal, aged 78. Eve was the mother of Julie Sharp of Fristling Hall, Margaretting Tye and her sister Tina. She was an independently-minded woman who people could not miss or forget, a much-loved mum, nan and great-nan, altogether a real female role model.

Appropriately, Tina and Julie along with her husband Gary and son Ben carried her coffin into Margaretting church for her funeral. Eve's sister Pat read the eulogy, and Julie and Tina read poems. Music at her funeral was chosen by the family to sum up Eve's character: "You're the best thing" by Gladys Knight and the Pips, "Lord of the Dance", "She" by Elvis Costello and "Livin' da Vida Loca" by Ricky Martin. Guests were all given a packet of forget me not seeds to grow to remind them next year of an unforgettable woman.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY - 8TH NOVEMBER 2020

This year we will not be holding a service in church. We will be placing twenty individually named wooden crosses in the grass verge along the gravel path leading to church in remembrance of the Margaretting men who died serving their country during the 1st and 2nd world wars.

There will be a short 'Act of Remembrance' at the War Memorial. This will include the reading of names inscribed on the war memorial, the laying of wreaths, sounding of "Last Post", two minutes of silence, the sounding of "Reveille", ending with the "Ode of Remembrance" and prayers.
