### PLANNING APPLICATIONS

#### Planning Applications received in March/April

24/00285/FUL - Land west of El-Rita, Maldon Road  
Change of use of land and hard surfacing for outside storage in association with existing business (Class E)

24/00321/FUL - Park Lodge Cottage, Writtle Road  
Proposal: Install air source heat pump on north elevation.

24/00245/FUL - Van Dykes, Margaretting Tye  
Proposal: Proposed extension to existing outbuilding.

24/00401/FUL - Hawthorns, Wantz Road  
Proposal: Demolition of existing residential dwelling, commercial buildings and storage areas and construction of three detached dwelling.

24/00421/FUL - Dunedin - Maldon Road  
Proposal: Proposed single storey side and rear wraparound extension (revision of approved application 23/01198/FUL)

24/00454/FUL - Webs Cottage, Main Road  
Proposal: Proposed two storey side extensions to existing studio flats. Alterations to fenestration to flats and bike/bin store.

Proposal: Two storey side extension and single storey rear extension with part duo pitched roof and part flat roof. New roof dormers. **Application refused**

Certification of lawfulness to regularise and establish extent of current development at site including steel framed warehouse, 3 x residential dwellings, 4 x store rooms, 1 x workshop and 1 x electricity point. **Split Decision**

24/00216/FUL - Killigrews, London Road  
Proposal: Demolition of garage. Construction of single storey building for garage, storage and staff accommodation with rooms in the roof (Changes to previously approved application (21/01921/FUL)) **Listed Building Consent Granted**

#### **March/April meetings**

**Village Website:** Links for residents to report problems to Essex County Council and Chelmsford City Council to be included on the parish council's webpage.

**Accounts:** Money held in 'Reserves'. Discussion on the different ways this money could be spent and whether the parish council could make a one-off lump sum payment to the P.W.L.B.

The following expenditure was agreed:

MDL £268 (grass cutting)

RCCE £60 (annual subscription)

WAVE £43 (water for allotments)

**Maldon Road:** Lavender Bank. D. Cannon to be asked if he would be interested in clearing the bank.

**Maldon Road Playing Field:** Rubbish left at the rear of the bungalows. This will be cleared when the new bench is installed. Discussion on installing a notice board.

**Wantz Road:** Parked vehicles. Cllr. Wallace to talk to the new owners of the garage by the crossroads.

**Three Mile Hill:** Two tents pitched on the central reservation. This has been reported to the City Council.

**Village Roads:** Increased litter. Discussion on whether to pay a parishioner to litter pick around the village.

**Village Trees:** Barletts' quote of £1,490 to fell the Copper Beech by the pond was agreed. Also agreed were quotes of £320 to plant a new Hornbeam and £300 to trim the weeping pears at the War Memorial. The TPO from the Copper Beech is to be carried over.

**Village Footpaths:** The following problems were reported: Footpath 22 overgrown. Whitesbridge Cottages to Martins Farm. Footpath 43 missing post to stop vehicles gaining access. Crondon Hall/Swan Lane.

**Village Hall:** PAT Testing and roof repairs completed.

Bookings are increasing; the secretary is looking into having hire prices advertised on the village website.

Benches for the Wood and Ife families will be the last ones to be installed on the playing field for the time being.

**D Day 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary:** A Wood to be asked to raise the flag at the war memorial. The soldier silhouette will be placed there for a two-week period.

**Pylons:** Consultation period. This ends 18th June. The parish council urge parishioners to comment before then. Website is [www.pylonseastanglia.co.uk](http://www.pylonseastanglia.co.uk)


