DEMOCRATIC TIME

Five members of the public present. The issues raised and discussed during democratic time included:

(i) Creation of new bridleway and closure of the footpath 21 crossing. It was agreed Network Rail's proposal to close the footpath 21 rail crossing and cessation of the intrusive train whistles is supported by local residents and the parish council. However, the proposal for a new bridleway (an off-road link along Maldon Road to bridleway 22) in place of the Margaretting footpath 21 crossing is not supported by the land owner and the residents living in the vicinity of the proposed bridleway. Local residents are concerned about the lack of consultation and information. The parish council confirmed it had not been consulted but is aware the Ramblers Association is keen to see an off-road link along Maldon Road to the pavement under the Maldon Road bridge in place of the Margaretting footpath 21 crossing. (ii) Parsonage Lane Rail Crossing It was agreed Network Rail's proposal to close this footpath crossing has far reaching implications for the residents on the other side of the railway line. The parish council has informed Network Rail and the Department of Transport that the restricted height of

(iii) St Margaret's Churchyard

A question was raised about the reduction in height of the south boundary hedge. It was explained the St Margaret's Church Support Group, which undertook the cutting back of the hedge, is now assisting St Margaret's Parochial Church Council in the maintenance of the church yard.

The south boundary hedge, neglected over the years, had become a row of overgrown trees with branches and side shoots overshadowing and encroaching on graves. The pollarding of 351 BUS ROUTE these trees should not prevent new growth. In a few years the south boundary would become a beech hedge of manageable height.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD Following the completion of the work

on the perimeter hedge the parish council received a request to remove a dead tree, scrub and ivy abutting a resident's rear fence. The request and estimate (£300) for the work was agreed. The weekly inspection of the playing field included a report that the litter bin adjacent to the youth shelter had remains of burnt aerosol spray and deodorant cans. This is not the first time burnt objects have been found in this particular bin. It was agreed to contact
