When the new housing estate was built in Margaretting in 1962 they moved into Orton Close. Don worked at Larmar Engineer-Christine, Caroline and Barry; Brenda's kind and chatty nature brought her many friends in the village.

For the summer holidays the family would go to Jaywick Sands. Brenda's children remember camping and sandy sandwiches - always a great adventure.

Brenda and Don always did things together; they enjoyed dinner dances, country and western and listening to music together. Brenda's favourite was Cliff Richard - we enjoyed 'Miss you nights' at her funeral.

When her children left home Brenda joined Don at Larmar Engineering where she worked for many years in the canteen until she retired; she also cleaned for the Bishop. She also joined in potato picking in the fields at Parsonage Lane – she would fry chips and wrap them in paper so that they looked like they came from the fish and chip shop. Brenda enjoyed cooking - at weekends the family had delicious home-baked cakes and sausage rolls.

Don and Brenda adored their thirteen grandkids and ten great grandkids. One memory was going to the swimming baths -Nan (Brenda) always made sure there would be a treat for the kids of burger and chips afterwards.

Brenda was a founder-member of The Over 60's Club and used to be in charge of the lottery and helped with the refreshments. She always looked forward to catching up with her friends there.

At her funeral in Margaretting Church we remembered Brenda as a woman of abundant love and a kind, loving smile – remembered in the poem 'A Smile' by Dale Carnegie. The final song was the beautiful and uplifting 'I am the Bread of Life', reminding us of her peaceful, spiritual nature.
