Matthew 25 v 35-36 I mentioned last month that there was to be a presentation at Ingatestone Church for the Brentwood Food Bank. It was very interesting and I have a better understanding of the support they give to families in this area. Any family receiving food is referred by another agency. The Food Bank then give this family enough food per person for 3 days (no matter how many people are in this family) - this enables the family to feed themselves and any children. Each family is allowed up to three parcels per year. The idea is not to have relying on this help. The Centre also offers tea/coffee when open and people can drop in and find someone to talk to.

For I was hungry and you gave me

unemployment and changes to benefits. In research done, we were told that 1 in 5 mums skip meals to feed their children, some consider stealing, some parents have to decide whether to pay the rent, heat the home or spend the money on food. This is bad enough but these statistics have been taken in this part of the County. Yes, families living very near us here are in desperate

MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - APRIL MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

One member of the public present. Issues raised included:

(i) Pot holes in the village requiring urgent attention and the slow response from ECC Highways. We confirmed these concerns had been reported to ECC Cllr Grundy.

(ii) Removal of temporary traffic warning signs for the refuge islands. We confirmed ECC Highways has this matter in hand.

(iii) Speed of traffic in Main Road. We discussed a suggestion that a mini roundabout at the cross roads would reduce the speed of traffic. We agreed to discuss this further at our May meeting and to ask Cllr Grundy to confirm the status of the 2010 speed restriction review for the county's A and B roads.

BRIDLEWAY AND FOOTPATHS

The removal of the missing post, metal stake and padlock (bridleway number 43) has been reported. ECC Highways has inspected and prioritised the bridge problem.

PARISH COUNCIL OFFICE

MAZTEC has acknowledged it did assume the applications from the village hall and the parish council were for the same project. We agreed to refer this matter to the village hall committee with the request that MAZTEC's grant be divided equally between the parish council and the village hall. We discussed RCCE's advice concerning which other funding organisations to approach.

VILLAGE SITES

<u>Lavender Bank</u>: We received further quotations for the supply and installation of railway sleepers. We accepted the lowest quote (£542).

War memorial site: The two weeping willow pear trees have been pruned.

ALLOTMENTS AND PLAY AREA

All the allotments are let. The annual rents are currently being collected. There has been a problem with one of the multi goal fences. This is being dealt with. The youth shelter seats will be re-galvanized once the weather improves. The ROSPA inspection will take place in May.

CHELMSFORD FLOOD ALLEVIATION SCHEME

The following are extracts from the latest fact sheet published by the Environment Agency in April. It provides information about the proposed flood alleviation scheme in Margaretting, its progress to date, and what the EA will be doing over the coming months.

What have we been doing? We have now completed the technical design of the flood storage area and we are currently developing the landscaping proposals. We have also been working with the parish council to develop the design of the traffic management work along Swan Lane and improvements to the walk boards at Whites Bridge.

What will we be doing? Over the coming months we plan to complete archaeological survey works, initial site clearance works and preparatory works to allow construction work to start this summer. We are developing a traffic management plan for the scheme and will seek a temporary speed restriction order along Swan Lane from Essex County Council. Taking on board comments from the parish council, we are now proposing wider passing bays along Swan Lane. This change will not result in the loss of any hedgerows or trees.

We will keep Margaretting Parish Council up to date with our proposals. We will continue to talk to local landowners who are affected by the scheme to ensure that there is minimal impact on their properties and businesses.

Prior to starting the main construction we will hold a public drop-in and exhibition to further explain our proposals and allow you to meet the key people who will be working on this stage of the project.

Proposed programme of work. To take advantage of best construction weather and when river flows are historically low and less likely to flood, we will carry out the work over the summer. We would expect to start the construction work in early summer 2013. We estimate it will take around six months to complete the flood storage area. The approximate schedule or our preparatory work is:

- Start site clearance work: Mid April up to 2 weeks of work
- Start passing bay work: Late April/early May (subject to ECC approval) - up to 4 weeks of work
- Set up site compound: Late May 2 weeks of work

How can you get involved or get in touch? We know that what happens in your local community is important to you and we will be updating you as the scheme develops. To ensure that you know how the project is progressing we will produce further fact sheets, keep the website (www.chelmsford.gov.uk/fas) up-to-date, and keep your parish council informed.

Please come along to the public drop-in on Friday 7th June in the village hall (2pm-7pm) to hear more about our proposals and meet the key people who will be working on the construction stage of the project.
