DEMOCRATIC TIME

Cllr I Grundy and six members of the public were present. The issues raised and discussed were:

Pumping Station: This site is still included in the Enforcement Notices.

Blue Shed: Nothing further to report.

(i) Affordable Housing

Two architects from CCC Property attended the meeting to find out if there would be any interest in a small development of affordable housing on a piece of land in Parsonage Lane. The scheme would primarily be offered to Margaretting residents before being offered to neighbouring villages.

CCC Property are willing to pay for a survey to find out if there is a need. The chairman explained, to his knowledge, there had been two surveys in the past to ascertain the need and on both occasions the Housing Associations would only consider building on land gifted to them. After the elections CCC Property will contact the Parish Council to find out the results of the previous housing surveys. It was noted there are no development sites in Margaretting identified in the Chelmsford City Council's Local Plan.

(ii) The White Hart Public House Members of the public were given the chance to explain their objections to a planning application from the White Hart. It was noted there have been twenty one objections to this planning application.

MAIN ROAD

<u>War Memorial</u>: It was suggested a bench to mark Tony Smith's fifty years service as a Margaretting parish councillor could be placed on the war memorial green.

Since this meeting it has been noted there is a clause in the deeds for the memorial site which stipulates the posts and chains surrounding the memorial must not be removed. An alternative site for a bench is to be identified and consulted on.

Bin at the cross roads with Wantz Road: It was agreed to fix a sign informing dog walkers they can deposit their dog waste bags in this bin.

THREE MILE HILL

Pumping Station: This site is still included in the Enforcement Notices.

Blue Shed: Nothing further to report.

Cycle Path: It was agreed to request spraying weed killer on the path from the golf course to Hylands Park is included in the list for the parish cleansing day team.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

<u>Allotments</u>: It was confirmed polytunnels are not allowed on an allotment.

Trees to the rear of Broad Oaks:
The chairman reported he had spoken to the tree warden and looked at the playing field lease which states the parish council must maintain the hedging - trees are not mentioned.
The clerk is to contact Chelmsford City Council for advice.

DEFIBRILLATOR

It was reported a drawing showing the preferred site for the defibrillator at the Black Bull had been sent to Greene King's property surveyors. And they had responded by suggesting a not so prominent site on the wall of a brick-built outhouse to the left of the pub. The chairman had subsequently contacted Greene King to explain it would be difficult to get a power supply to this area, the roof was dangerous and it would be difficult for the landlady to keep an eye on the defibrillator.

Since the meeting a Greene King surveyor has visited the site. An alternative area for the defibrillator to be housed (at the front of the Black Bull) has been proposed and agreed.

VILLAGE HALL

The Chairman updated the meeting on village hall committee's plans to replace the boiler and difficulties associated with the warm air system.

VILLAGE MAP

A proposal for the publication of a map identifying all the public rights of way in the parish has been put on hold until after the new parish council has been elected in May.

Cllr Paoli-Burke will be presenting this proposal and associated costings to the new council.

Addition of ten outdoor dining pods to rear of amenity space.

19/00260/FUL - Lynton Lodge, Main Road: Demolition of half of existing building. Single storey rear and side extension.

19/00332/FUL - Longcroft, Maldon Road: Demolition of 'Guest Block'. Hipped roof changed to gable ends with three dormers to front elevation and three additional windows to rear. First floor extension with balcony.

A 12 IMPROVEMENT WORKS A12 northbound between junction 12 Mountnessing and junction 14 Margaretting

Kier Services, on behalf of Highways England, will be carrying out road safety improvement works at the above location. The works will involve road lining, stud marking and roadside sign installation works.

A full closure of the A12 northbound between junction 12, Mountnessing and junction 14, Margaretting will start Monday 29 April, lasting five nights, with working hours of 8pm to 6am. This full closure is needed to facilitate the road lining and stud marking renewal works.

Diversion route

A clearly signed diversion route will be in place, diverting traffic via the A12 at junction 12, Mountnessing via B1002 Roman Road, through Ingatestone and Margareting, before re-joining the A12 northbound at junction 15, Margaretting.

Kier Services apologise for the local inconvenience these works may cause and thank you for your patience whilst they carry out strategic maintenance to the road network. They would be grateful if you could share information locally about the works.
