Village Hall

'Mates' (a mental health group) has decorated the village hall changing room, held a charity football match and installed planters. They are now looking at having the boiler serviced.

Dog Waste Bins

These are being monitored to see that the bins are being emptied regularly.

Main Road

(i) Parked vehicles obscuring the 'school warning sign'. A resident reported the sign cannot be seen when it flashes at school drop off and pick up times. It was suggested the sign should be moved to Baskervilles or a new one installed by Baskervilles. This suggestion to be followed up with Highways.

(ii) War Memorial Flagpole.

A replacement Union Flag has been purchased from Windsock, a local company based in Ivy Barn Lane.

(iii) Village Pond.

The newly planted tree needs attention.

This tree has a TPO and if it died would have to be replaced. Nearby residents to be asked to water it.

Maldon Road Playing Field

(i) Dog fouling in playing field.

Concerns about the amount of dog fouling in the playing field have been investigated. But, on inspection it was thought to be wild animal mess.

(ii) Safety Surfaces.

The City Parks Department to be asked to carry out repairs to the safety surfaces.

(iii) Trees requiring attention.

CHP to be reminded about the overgrown conifer trees.

MARGARETTING WAR MEMORIAL

Each year we stand at the War Memorial and listen to the names read aloud of the Margaretting men who died serving their country during the 1st and 2nd world wars. What we don't hear is their stories, their ages, service details, ranks, awards and whereabouts in Margaretting they lived before joining the military. Second Lieutenant Thomas Hills Christy is one such name – killed in action in France on 12 April 1918 aged 20 years - commemorated on the Margaretting War Memorial and a family plaque in Margaretting Church. He is also recognised on The Essex Yeomanry Memorial in St Peter's Chapel, Chelmsford Cathedral and commemorated on the Pozieres Memorial, Bay 7, France.

Thomas Hills Christy was born on 20 March 1898. The 1901 census lists the family living at Margaretting Hall Farm (Church Lane). His father David Christy is recorded as an employer/farmer. Thomas was educated at Sidcot School, a boarding school, in Somerset. On leaving school he joined the Inns of Court Officer Training Corps. in November 1915 aged 17 years. When old enough for a commission he was posted in December 1916 to No 1 Cavalry Cadet School at Netheravon, Wiltshire. The following April he was gazetted as a Second Lieutenant to the Essex Yeomanry and posted to France in November 1917. He was attached to the Essex Regiment during the battle of Somme and was killed in the successful counterattack at Hangard on 12 April 1918. His remains were not recovered from the battlefield. He has no known grave. His Medal Card and Roll show he was entitled to The British War Medal and The Victory Medal which would have been sent to his parents after the war.

My thanks to Cllr Gillian Bonnett and her husband, a retired Essex Yeoman, who on a recent visit to St Margaret's church noticed the Hills Christy family plaque and shared this information. *Penny Savill*
