ACT OF REMEMBRANCE AND WREATH LAYING 'WE SHALL REMEMBER THEM' 11AM SUNDAY, 11 NOVEMBER

We will gather at the War Memorial for our Act of Remembrance at 10:55am on Sunday, 11 November. As usual a bugler will play last post and reveille and the exhortation will be read by representatives of the older and younger members of the community. Included in this year's Act of Remembrance will be the unveiling of a commemorative plaque to mark the 100 years since the end of the First World War. Also, in line with the Lord Lieutenant of Essex's request, St Margaret's church bells will be rung half muffled before 10:30am and unmuffled at 12.30pm as will other bells in churches throughout the county.

He will be dearly missed by his family, his friends and his many farming colleagues and acquaintances. Our deepest sympathies are now with his wife Angela, daughter Diana and son Robert.


