## ST MARGARET'S CHURCH SUPPORTERS GROUP

Members will be pleased to know over the past year, due to the generosity of your contributions, we have been able to carry out some important work. All the guttering round the church has been repaired and painted. The tree that was reaching over the roof and filling the gutters with leaves has been cut back. The leak in the toilet has been repaired, dried out and the wall area plastered and painted. The mould under the pews is being treated and is ongoing. In the graveyard the gravel path is regularly sprayed and the new rose bed pruned and weeded. Spraying continues to keep down the brambles and clear some of the graves that are not maintained by family and friends. The wild flower meadows have developed and we have re-sown seeds, but the grass is still very dominant in places. Hopefully next year it will be even better. Grass and hedge cutting continues regularly and the beetle bank is developing. We have noticed a number of trees falling over and shedding branches, so far we have been able to manage them ourselves.

We have had some lovely days spent in the churchyard doing the work as it is a special place.
