MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - SEPTEMBER MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

One member of the public present. Issues raised included the resurfacing of Maldon Road and Wantz Road. Ouestions had been asked about why under the railway bridge had not been resurfaced, the yellow lines not reinstated as previously and why there were no white lines to the entrance of the village hall. These questions will be raised with Highways. The recent article in Essex Chronicle concerning local farmer Mr Sharpe and the flood alleviation scheme was discussed. Another topic raised was the book mentioned in last month's newsletter 'Captive in East Anglia'. The meeting was informed that the prisoners of war (Italian and Germans) from the Harold Wood camp had been employed in Margaretting.

VILLAGE PROJECTS

Parish Council Office: The date for the official opening is yet to be agreed. The BT broadband connection is currently being sorted out. We agreed to publicise our intention to hold parish council surgeries in the new office. The first one will be on Saturday 20th September (10.30 to 12.00) to coincide with the village coffee morning.

<u>Village Hall Road Sign</u>: We are now waiting for the Highways Validation Engineer's comments and permission. <u>Bus Shelters</u>: The repairs to the shelter opposite the Black Bull will begin in October.

<u>Village Sign</u>: As we do not have a mould for the existing sign we agreed all plans to renew this sign should be placed on hold for a year.

Village Gateways: The positioning of the gateways has been agreed by Highways. However, Highways has put forward an alternative design to the one we submitted. We noted their design had been copied from a commercial catalogue. And, in our opinion did not suit Margaretting's rural environment.

<u>Lavender Bank</u>: Nothing further to report.

SKATE BOARD RAMPS

A resident in Maldon Road has expressed concern that none of the residents in Maldon Road (whose gardens back onto the playing field) had been consulted about this project. We agreed the young people are not in a position to consult at the moment because it is not clear whether or not it would be feasible to install the type of ramp required (a bespoke noiseless concrete design) in the playing field. Play equipment companies are to be contacted for advice.

RED DOG WASTE BINS

A bin has been ordered for the railway crossing end of Parsonage Lane. A number of residents have been consulted about the one for the cul-de-sac end of Orton Close. These residents were of the opinion that there was no real need for one to be installed there.

MALDON ROAD

We agreed to remind Highways that when it rains there is still a flooding problem in the vicinity of Nun's Crossing and this is a potential hazard for the winter months.

THREE MILE HILL

Not all the litter left behind after the V Festival has been cleared from the stretch of Three Mile Hill without a footpath and from the hedges in Private Road. We agreed to ask Chelmsford Council's Street Scene Services to litter pick these two roads. We agreed also to request a speed check for Three Mile Hill with the view to having the speed limit reduced. This will be an agenda item for the next meeting.

VILLAGE TREES

We agreed the Grass Roots Tree and Garden Services quotation to cut down a dead tree by the pond, reduce the height of two cherry trees in the playing field and reduce the height of the weeping willow at The Tye.
