ST MARGARET'S CHURCH NEWS

Church Building: Every five years, the church building is inspected by an architect or chartered building surveyor approved by the Chelmsford Diocesan Advisory Committee. St Margaret's quinquennial inspection will take place on Wednesday 23 October. These inspections help to make sure the church building is kept in good repair. Recent repairs and improvements to St Margaret's include making good a leak in the main water supply pipe in the church and overhauling the sound and induction loop systems.

Churchyard: The churchyard plan and index listing all the graves and headstone inscriptions is now up to date. There are 355 recorded graves in the churchyard - the dating of external gravestone monuments, particularly the earlier ones, was not without its problem. The oldest existing headstone, which can be clearly read, belongs to 'John Cooke, son of John Cooke, butcher who died June 3rd 1708 aged 27 years'.

Church Tours and Open Afternoons: Donations received from U3A church tours, hosted by the church support group, have helped boost our school to church transport fund. A new 'church is open today' sign, placed at the Main Road junction with Church Lane, attracted extra visitors to the June and July Sunday open afternoons and to the Friends of Essex Churches riders and striders open day on Saturday, 14 September.

Remembrance Sunday -10 November 2019 There will be a short 10am service in church followed by a 11am Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial.

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Three members of the public were present. The issues raised included: Church Lane: Local farmer, Mr G Sharp, reported Network Rail wanted to build a road from Church Lane across the field towards Brook Farm. The Parish Council confirmed it had not received any information from Network Rail regarding the closure of the railway crossing. Flood Alleviation Scheme: The parish council also confirmed it had not received any information from the Environment Agency regarding the Flood Alleviation Scheme.

MATTERS ARISING

Memorial Bench: Lord Petre has given his permission for the bench to go on the green between Yew Tree Cottage and Peacocks.

WhatsApp Group: Cllr Wallace reported thirty five people had signed up. <u>Defibrillator - The Black Bull:</u> The chairman reported he had received two quotes to install a new distribution box and provide a test certificate. It was agreed to go with A. J. Electrical's quote of £475.00

Dog Fouling - Maldon Rd Playing Field: Cllr Wallace described a homemade dispenser for dog waste bags which he had seen in Sandon. A Wallace will make one and take a photo for the WhatsApp Group.

COMMUNITY MATTERS

Repairs and Maintenance: It was agreed the chairman would contact three builders (two within the village) with specifications for the various repairs needed.

MALDON ROAD

Allotments: The parish council asked the clerk to contact the allotment owners where a shed has been erected and suggest they apply to the City Council for permission for the shed to remain on the allotment. The parish council has map showing all the local public no objections and will confirm this in writing. It was agreed the allotments in Margaretting are heavily subsidised by the parish council. To rent a same size allotment in Ingatestone would cost in the region of £146 a year. It was agreed also that the clerk would write to all allotment holders with a request that overgrown allotments are cleared or cut back and covered over. Clerk will also ask for written confirmation that the allotment is still required. It was noted there is a working water tank House, Wantz Road. Application on site.

Playing Field Trees: The clerk will contact both parishioners who had contacted her about the trees on their boundaries to let them know the playing field lease with Chelmsford City Council states the Parish Council is responsible for the hedges and not the trees. A site meeting with David Ford (CCC Trees) will be arranged.

Pavements: It was reported someone had fallen due to the poor state of the footpath outside the older people's bungalows. Cllr Paoli-Burke is going to forward a photograph of the pavement to the Clerk to report to Highways.

VILLAGE HALL

The chairman reported on the ongoing heating problems. Concerns were expressed that bookings will be lost if the new heating is not in place by the winter. Cllr Wallace offered to attend the next village hall meeting to discuss the problem.

AUTUMN MONTHS

Essex Wildlife Tips

Help garden hibernators. Ensure your garden is ready for hibernators. Lateflowering plants provide nectar to late-summer invertebrates. Supplying hedgehog food can provide them the weight they need for winter. Place leaf piles in a quiet part of your garden for Hedgehogs to hibernate in. A log pile can provide a winter refuge for Toads and invertebrates.

Clear out nest boxes. From September, after the summer breeding season is over and garden birds have all left their nests, clean out your nest boxes to ensure no parasites are left behind. Placing hay or wood shavings in the clean box can provide a safe hibernation site for small mammals, or birds can use it as a winter roost.

DOGS ON PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY Remember to follow the country side code Respect-Protect-Enjoy

Many public rights of way in Margaretting pass over farm land including pasture land used for grazing livestock. Although legislation does not require your dog to be on a lead whilst on a public right of way, you must ensure that you have proper control of your dog at all times. Dogs are not entitled to roam away from the path and if they do, the dog owner could be guilty of committing trespass against the landowner.

It is advisable to ensure your dog stays close where you can see it and not let it roam so far away that it cannot hear or chooses to ignore your commands.
