ST MARGARET'S CHURCH NEWS

The PCC's request to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission for help in looking after one of our two war graves has prompted this welcome reply from the CWGC.

"We are writing to inform you that our Regional Supervisor will be requesting permission to erect a standard pattern headstone on the grave of F H Sawyer as the private memorial does not adequately commemorate him."

To say the existing memorial in our churchyard does not adequately commemorate Private F H Sawyer, who died at Port Pitt hospital, Chatham, March 6th 1919 aged 31 years, is an understatement. The memorial kerbstones had sunk in to the ground, become overgrown and the inscription impossible to read.

Without the existence of Ingatestone and Fryerning Historical Society's

1990 churchyard map this grave may never have been found.

Our second war grave commemorates Private H Beer who served in the Durham Light Infantry. He died 30th January 1919 aged 23 years.

To let the public know we have two war graves the Commission has agreed to install and maintain a CWGC sign at the entrance to the churchyard.

ST MARGARET'S CHURCH SERVICES

For the foreseeable future St Margaret's will be offering one church service only a month. With five churches to support and with no curate to assist him it will be impossible for Revd Patrick to officiate at every Sunday service in the benefice. Added to this it seems very unlikely there will be a replacement for Revd Celia for at least twelve months. If we can find local clergy support for our monthly services we will revert to a 10am service as in previous years.

September's church service at 11:15am on Sunday 17th will be our harvest festival celebration. The church will be decorated to reflect the harvest season. Do come along and join us. It's one of the oldest and traditional festivals in Britain taking place on or near the Sunday of the harvest moon. A time when farmers give thanks for a successful harvest.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

17/00911/FUL: Peacock's Cottage, Main Road. Single storey side extension. Five roof lights to ground floor pitched roof.

Single storey side extension. Alterations to windows and doors to existing dwelling and five roof lights to ground floor pitched roof. Addition of window to rear elevation. Internal alterations and alterations to roof tiles to ground floor pitched roof.

WANTZ ROAD A12 SLIP ROAD INGATESTONE DIRECTION

Six lots of fly tipping on the Ingatestone direction slip road have been reported to Chelmsford City Council.
