COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

Members of the parish council recognise excess speed in Main Road is an important issue for the local community and at their July meeting they discussed forming a community speed watch group.

Community Speed Watch is a locally driven initiative where active members of the **community** join together with the support of the Police to monitor **speeds** of vehicles using speed detection devices. More than 85 community speed watch groups are now operating across the Essex Police area, providing regular monitoring of vehicle speeds within their own locations.

Monitoring of speeds are undertaken by pairs of volunteers in reflective 'Community Speedwatch' jackets supported by advance warning signs. Results are forwarded via log sheets

to The Casualty Reduction Unit for processing, and warning letters are sent to the registered keepers of the vehicles monitored travelling in excess of the posted speed limit. First-time offenders will be sent warning letters by the Police, second and subsequent offences will lead to Police action.

A Margaretting initiative will rely heavily on volunteers and the parish council will need to know if it has enough volunteers who are willing and able to form a community speed watch group.

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Parsonage Lane - railway crossing footpath. There has been no further information about the Public Inquiry into the Essex and Others Level Crossing Reduction Order which is due to reconvene on 25 September. The damaged track to the properties on the other side of the crossing has been repaired by local residents.

Footpath 39 has been cleared of vegetation. It was noted a local estate agent had fixed an advertising board to the footpath sign in Private Road. A photograph of the board and subsequent damage this caused to the footpath sign has been sent to Essex Highways.

18/01245/FUL - 1 and 2 Green Cottages, Ivy Barn Lane. Demolition of domestic outbuilding and construction of two storey side extensions, raising eaves to rear and single storey rear extensions to both cottages with extension to crossover & new crossover

The following decisions were noted. 18/00381/FUL - Umtali, Maldon Road - Replacement Garage. Planning permission granted.

18/00359/FUL - Land at Longcroft, Maldon Road. Construction of a detached dwelling and double garage. Associated works including new fence and improvement to the existing access. *Planning permission granted*.

PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING SATURDAY, 4 AUGUST

The national initiatives for the WWI centenary anniversary on Sunday 11 November were reported and discussed. These included schools being asked to make 100 hearts for 100 years and the placing of silhouettes of first world war soldiers in churches. The PCC is going to see if the local school would like to exhibit the hearts made by its pupils in St Margaret's. The idea of whether St Margaret's should organise an open church day to exhibit the hearts with ringing the bells to mark the anniversary was discussed also.

Other agenda items included Diocesan approval for a CWGC Gallipoli marker to be placed on Private Sawyer's grave in St Margaret's churchyard; the licensing of Tim Lee, Lay Reader, on Sunday, 30 September in St Giles; the Benefice Harvest Supper and quiz in St John's (the old tin church in Mountnessing), on Saturday, 22 September.

Revd Patrick and Archdeacon Elizabeth have met to discuss the three parishes' expectations for of the vacant house for duty post. These will go to Bishop John (the new bishop of Bradwell). Parishioners are encouraged to talk about the vacancy - there may be someone who knows someone who would be interested in applying for the post.
