### JULY MEETING

#### **Accounts:**

**Village Maintenance:** D. Cannon will be carrying out some jobs around the village for up to ten hours a month. Suggested jobs that needed doing included: installing the bench and notice board at the Maldon Road playing field, clearing the lavender bank in Maldon Road, clearing the triangle of vegetation at the Maldon Road crossroads.

#### **War Memorial:**

David Frost attended the meeting to report on the research he had carried out regarding the four missing names. He had obtained a copy of the Listed Buildings Consent form and two sets of relatives had been contacted. Cllr Blurton will be advising the parish council regarding the process to obtain a listed building consent. Robert Fletcher is in touch with the Memorial Trust - the group that will consider and hopefully give permission for the missing names to be added to the War Memorial.

**Dog Waste Bins.** The bin at The White Hart hasn't been emptied for a few weeks - Clerk to request this is emptied and to ask for a new bin to be installed by the gate that goes into the playing field at the top of Pennys Lane.

**Allotments.** Cllr Quilter will be reporting on the state of the unused allotments at the September meeting. The Clerk will be contacting all allotments holders to request they don't use the bins in the playing field.

**Village Hall Report:** Included in Cllr Smith's report were details of various jobs completed and jobs that had been identified which could be undertaken by members of the village hall committee.

It was noted the pump for the sewage was broken - someone had to be called out to clear the system - a new pump was quoted at £4,500 plus vat.

Cllr Smith had spoken to ACRE for advice on how the parish council can help the village hall which included adding the village hall to the precept. The Clerk will be contacting EALC for advice on this.
