STEVE WARR 4th March 1953 - 21st June 2025

A service of thanksgiving was held on Friday 25th July at Bullfinches - in a marquee in one of the paddocks - a perfect and fitting location to celebrate Steve's life. It was a lovely sunny afternoon with everyone before the service, mingling in the open air, enjoying drinks and taking advantage of that time to exchange their personal memories of Steve.

The order of service, put together by Liz, was led by the Revd Canon Lee Francis-Dehqani. Two poems were read aloud - 'All is Well' - Canon Henry Scott-Hollow and 'Shed No Tears' - David Harkins.

Two well known hymns were sung - 'Dear Lord and Father of Mankind' and 'We Plough the Fields and Scatter'

During a pause for reflection a recording of 'Fields of Gold' sung by Eva Cassidy was listened to; it was accompanied by a member of Steve's family playing saxophone. The exit music, chosen from Steve's play list, was 'Free Bird' - Lynyrd Skynyrd. Thoughts and memories shared by Steve's family, his friends, former students and work colleagues, all highlighted how much Steve was loved, liked and respected. They emphasised Steve's calm and kind nature, his measured approach, his love of horses, dogs and fishing, his passion for agriculture and the countryside. And, not to forget, his skill at 'home brewing' which over the years had been sampled and enjoyed by so many.

Do Bird Feeders Attract Rats?

'Yes, bird feeders can attract rats but usually under certain conditions. Like mice, they will be attracted to the spilled bird seed that has fallen to the ground. Whereas rats are normally more cautious than mice and nocturnal, if the food source is easy to access, they'll still be after it.'

To discourage the rats, you can use rodent-proof feeders with cages or with some sort of protective barriers, and you must clean up around the feeder frequently to avoid tempting them with leftover seeds.'

She has diligently collected litter and taken responsibility for planting, tending, and weeding the flowers along the roadside. Additionally, each year on Remembrance Day, Marion ensures that poppies are placed at the bus stops to honour the occasion.

Marion consistently monitors the brook to ensure that debris does not obstruct its natural flow, occasionally enlisting assistance from family and friends when additional resources are necessary. When overgrown tree branches impede visibility for drivers or hinder pedestrian access on pavements, Marion and her team promptly address these issues. Her commitment extends beyond the village; she also removes litter and maintains pathways during her walks to Ingatestone.

Through her ongoing efforts, Marion contributes significantly to maintain a lovely and pleasant environment in our community.

IMPROVED 351 BUS SERVICE - COMING SOON

Ingatestone and Fryerning Parish Council is pleased to announce following a successful grant application to Essex County Council's 'Love Your Bus' scheme, the 351 bus service will soon be running more frequently.

From 1st September, six additional buses will operate half hourly Monday to Friday between 9am and 3pm, in both directions.
