The following matters were reported/discussed/agreed at the July meeting.

Essex County Council: Cllr Mike Steel (Shadow Cabinet member for Highways and Infrastructure and member of the Scrutiny and Planning Committee) attended the meeting.

He gave an update on: **Members Highways Initiative** (this has now ceased); **Highways Draft Speed Strategy** (waiting to see if the new Reform ECC administration will take this forward); **Highway Rangers** (now taken on by Chelmsford City Council which can undertake a range of minor environmental and maintenance tasks); **Local Government**

Reorganisation and Devolution (LGR - Reform to submit a formal judicial review. Devolution - It seems likely that a Greater Essex Combined County Authority will still be formed and we will have elections for a Mayor in 2028);

Minerals Local Plan (yet to be completed);

Pylons (In all 3 National Grid consultations Cllr Steel opposed the whole pylon run. 11 of the 12 parish councils Cllr Steel represents have grouped together and produced a joint response)

Lorna Cannon - Peacocks Award 2026

The Peacocks Community Award for 2026 is awarded to Lorna Cannon in recognition of her time, continuing support and in recognition of her contributions to the village. Most recently becoming secretary of the village hall committee, becoming instrumental in the redecorating of the village hall, finding grants and funding for the paint, liaising with the decorator and being involved with multiple fund raising efforts, from selling Bric a Brac to organising coffee mornings.

Lorna has been a key committee member of the Margaretting Horticultural Village Fete in one way or another for over 21 years. She has put up gazebos, run stalls, booked stalls and organised entertainment. She has worked closely with the local school displaying children's art, taught maypole dancing and took on the responsibility of designing the posters for the event along with having them printed. Lorna also organises the schedule for all the horticultural classes in the hall, the judges, the awards which includes the Banksian Medal award that is presented to any individual exhibitor who has scored the highest points in the Horticultural Classes in the current year and the engraving of all the cups.

During 2025/26 Lorna has organised and has assisted in organising various fund raising events in the village hall from coffee mornings, a mini Christmas market, dance extravaganza to quiz nights which has raised funds to help with the continued maintenance and refurbishment of the village hall and recreation ground. The redecoration of the main hall was refreshed at the end of 2025 and the rest of the building followed shortly after.

Lorna moved to the village 29 years ago, for 2 years she was a volunteer at the local school listening to readers and has worked at the school for nearly 23 years. In 2023 she was awarded The Pearson National Teaching Award, this is a UK-wide celebration recognizing excellence in education. Often dubbed the "Oscars" of the teaching profession, the awards honor outstanding teachers, support staff, and school leaders across early years, primary, secondary, and further education. The villagers of Margaretting were extremely proud of Lorna when in June 2023 Lorna won a Pearsons National Teachers award.

On behalf of Margaretting we extend our sincere appreciation to Lorna for her dedication and contribution.
