As you will hopefully be aware, the Government is testing a national emergency alert system on April 23 which will send a notification and emit a loud noise even if phones are on silent.



Boundary Changes

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England

A new pattern of electoral divisions is being developed for Essex County Council.

The Local Government Boundary Commission has decided that the number of councillors in Essex should be 77. This is a change from the current council which has 75.

The Commission wants to hear what residents and organisations think about their local area. A 10-week consultation on the proposals will run until 5 June 2023.


