



# Temporary changes to your recycling and rubbish collection



Households in the north of the Borough on a Green Week commencing 13 April, will have their rubbish and recycling collected as follows:

13 April 11 May 8 June Food Waste

Paper, card and plastic (max total of 6

clear bags)

20 April 18 May 15 June Household rubbish - maximum of

4 x 60 litre black bags OR

1x black wheelle bin + 1x 60 litre black bag

Household rubbish - maximum of: 4 x 60 litre black bags OR

There are no changes to collection days on Bank Holidays.

Garden waste and textiles collections are suspended until further notice.

Please place your recycling and rubbish on your property boundary by 7am on your normal collection day. Please ensure bags are securely tied and bin lids are shut.

If you're self-isolating, either as a precaution or because you have coronavirus (COVID-19) please follow these four simple steps to reduce the spread of the virus:

- Place all personal waste such as used tissues and disposable cleaning cloths, securely in a plastic bag or bin liner
- Place this plastic bag inside another plastic bag and tie securely
- Store these bags separately to other waste for at least 72 hours
- After 72 hours, this double bagged rubbish can be put in your general rubbish as normal

# Green boxes: To save time please separate glass and cans

If you only have one green box for recycling cans and glass, you can use a second container of a similar size and weight to separate your cans and glass. (i.e. old bucket, washing up bowl etc..)

To save time and to ensure the crews can get to every household, please no lids on boxes.

**Plastic, paper and cardboard:** you can reduce the volume by flattening cardboard boxes. Rinse plastic bottles, flatten and put lid back on. There is a **six bag limit.** 

**Bonfires** Although garden waste collections have been suspended temporarily, to ensure frontline services continue and staff can adhere to the government guidance issued on social distancing, both Colchester and Braintree councils are asking for residents' cooperation in protecting everyone's health by not burning their waste while they wait to have it collected.

Others living near them may have had their breathing affected due to the virus or have other respiratory problems, such as asthma or COPD, that could be worsened by smoke.

Smoke from bonfires is anti-social and contributes to air pollution, thereby creating a nuisance to those who simply want fresh air for their daily exercise.

Essex Fire and Rescue Service is also requesting that you do not burn waste as there has been a 100% increase in call-outs mostly caused by fires which have got out of control.

# **Borough Councillor Peter Chillingworth**

With the present epidemic of the Coronavirus, Colchester Borough Council have reviewed its Pandemic Flu Plan and have established a coordinating group of senior managers. Meeting 3 times a week, it updates information and the national situation to ensure that 12 crucial services continue to be delivered. These range from waste collections and street cleaning to bereavement services and environmental health. Staff are kept regularly up-dated and arrangements are in hand if sickness should start to affect the critical services.

A planning application had been submitted just before Christmas for 10 travellers' pitches on land to the east of Goodwins Farm, Mount Bures Road, Wakes Colne, but close to the boundary with Mount Bures. The application has since been withdrawn.

The entrance to the site would have been onto a Protected Lane. Such lanes receive some additional planning protection. When asked if this designation could be extended to other lanes in the area, I explained the criteria were drawn up by the County Council in 1974 and probably could not be used to extend the system. However, I put the suggestion to the Planning Policy Team who confirmed that at least the present designation would continue in the emerging Local Plan.

Following the declaration of a Climate Emergency, supported unanimously by Full Council in July, a Task and Finish Group formed to advice Cabinet and Council on how this should be taken forward, has just submitted its Climate Emergency Action Plan (CEAP). It proposes that the Council becomes carbon-neutral by 2030. This has now been endorsed by Cabinet and Full Council. The Carbon Trust who has previously produced Carbon Action Plans for the Council will continue to advise us. The Council had reached its 2020 target of reducing carbon emissions by 40% one year early. To help implement the CEAP the Council has appointed a full-time officer. Carbon reduction will be embedded in all future Council policies.

However, a major task will be to retrofit all our Council houses to minimise heating and wasting energy. 2040 might be a more realistic target for this because of the cost. Therefore it will be a challenge for us all to bring our own homes up to a similar standard by the national target date of 2050 when, by law, the country must be carbon-neutral.

ALL THESE CREATURES NEED URGENT HELP AS A MATTER OF URGENCY BY CREATING HABITAT RATHER THAN DESTROYING IT.



# Social distancing - for dogs!


During this time of social distancing please remember that some dogs need space too!

# STAY SAFE FROM COURIER FRAUD





Advice and tips to spot the scams

We are reminding people in Essex to be vigilant following reports that fraudsters are attempting to take advantage of the current climate by carrying out crime online and at people's doorsteps.

Sadly fraudsters will look to take advantage of any situation. This means tricking people into parting with their money and information, including posing as government officials, bank or other financial services employees by text message, online or by knocking at doors.

While we have only received a handful of incidents, it's important that people be mindful before handing over money or personal details.

# Some simple steps you can take are:

- Do not assume or believe a call, a knock on the door or a deal online is genuine.
- Take five minutes before taking action and trust your instinct. If it doesn't feel real or genuine, it probably isn't.
- Challenge any calls, visits or messages you may receive.
- Never click on links and never divulge personal information the police and government departments will never ask you for these details.
- If you receive any fake gov.uk/coronavirus messages, please report these to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040.
- Contact your bank immediately if you think you are a victim of a scam.



# **Take Three Ingredients**

If you are struggling to put together a meal with what's left in your cupboards, help is at hand. Or, if you have acquired a more frugal life style during these hard times and want to "make do" and cook nutritiously, albeit simply, here's one of Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall's recipes to try. Serves 4:

4 large sausages, 300g pasta such as fusilli or penne, 1/2 green cabbage (savoy, toughest ribs removed, shredded). Fry sausages in 1 tbsp rapeseed, sunflower or olive oil, gently, turning often, 10 mins till golden brown. Take out and cut into bite size pieces, put back in pan, fry 5 more mins.

Cook pasta till al dente (tells you on packet) adding cabbage 3 mins before end of cooking time. Drain, keep water for a sauce if you wish, or drain and toss into sausages, Salt and pepper.

Alternatives worth a try: potatoes instead of pasta, leeks i.o. cabbage or spring greens
