214/2020 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE:

Twenty entries were submitted for the Art Contest for children aged between 4 - 11 Darcy Hudson aged 10 won the competition and a £50 voucher

No entries were received for the Video Competition for young people aged between 12 - 17. The Council will re-run the video competition in August with a £100 prize voucher for the winner. It will be advertised it in the newsletter to promote participants A short Neighbourhood Plan consultation video is a being launched in August at the same time and will also be advertised in the newsletter to encourage residents to give their views and /or to join focus groups to participate in five key areas identified in the consultation (1. transport/roads, 2. education/health, 3. design/conservation, 4. housing and 5. environment/green space).

A second transport assessment will be undertaken when information on transport from Basildon and Essex County Councils are received

The Council concluded resident involvement is crucial to help develop a meaningful Neighbourhood Plan.

## 218/2020 COMMUNITY PROJECTS:

The Council made an insurance claim for the vandalised item of Outdoor Gym and were awarded £1,143.00. Although it has been agreed to remove all the items of Outdoor Gym equipment the money will be spent towards other equipment yet to be decided. An article will go into in the newsletter asking residents for suggestions

# 219/2020 OUTDOOR GYM:

The chairman reported a resident had contacted the Council about the removal of the Outdoor Gym and asked if they could have an item of equipment for their personal use once it was removed. Acting on advice received the Council considered it was not safe for physical equipment to be donated to the public. Equipment of this nature is designed to be installed by a specialist contractor using the correct manufacturer specification. The Council had been informed current scrap prices are very low. Cllr Bunting proposed all items of Outdoor Gym are scrapped, seconded by Cllr Cottrell - **Agreed** 

The Council considered the quotation from contractor Peter Thomas to remove all the Outdoor Gym equipment and dealt with as per the specification.
