243/2020 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

To receive and agree the minutes of Noak Bridge Parish Council held on Tuesday 21st July 2020, proposed by Cllr Cottrell, seconded by Cllr Bunting that the minutes are a true and

accurate record of the meeting - Agreed

244/2020 CO-OPTION OF PARISH COUNCILLOR'S:

Cllr Bunting reported that she would be moving in the not too distant future. As a precautionary measure to keep the Council quorate advice was sought from the Basildon Council monitoring officer. The chairman interviewed Jacqui Dowton and James Guthrie as both had shown an active interest in the Parish Council and the Neighbourhood Plan.

They would be Members' until the May 2021 local elections.

Cllr Sargent proposed, seconded by Cllr Bunting that Jacqui Downton and James Guthrie join the Council with full voting rights - **Agreed**

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245/2020 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE:

The chairman reported that the continuation of the Covid pandemic had made it difficult for the Council to set a date for the next consultation stage of the Neighbourhood Plan and to release of the short video. The delay has had a knock-on effect of the publication of the newsletter. Members to hold a working party to discuss and agree dates on Council plans to hold a drop-in session on a Saturday morning in November to coincide

with the release of a short consultation video and distribution of the newsletter. The dates will be published in the newsletter and notice boards

246/2020 COMMUNITY PROJECTS:

Durban Lane Steps

Cllr's Buckley & Ball informed the Council they would support the Parish Council application to reconstruct the Durban Lane Steps with funding of £2k from their Locality Budget. ECC would be contacting the Council with terms & conditions and an agreement form to complete. The Council will obtain contractor quotations to be agreed at the next meeting

Durban Lane Pond

Following the site visit to the Durban Lane pond in July the Council officer had advised the Council the ponds works would cost £6k. The Council considered if they would financially support the pond project. Cllr Dowton was asked manage the project. Cllr Bunting proposed the Council support the project with a figure of £4k, the same amount spent on Coppice Lane Pond, this was seconded by Cllr Guthrie - **Agreed**

Swan Sign

The Council considered whether to fund a new swan sign in Crouch Street due to two previous wood carved signs having split down the middle. Cllr Sargent had referred the broken sign to the Council Housing service some time ago as the sign was situated on housing land. As yet a decision has not yet been reached.

After discussion it was considered the location of the sign did not benefit the parish as a whole, there was a parish sign located in Wash Road. Members felt the sign should be left for the Housing service to resolve - **Agreed**

Bridgecote Lane Sign

The Council had previously agreed to fund a new sign on the grass verge in Bridgecote Lane, (Bridge Street end) at the request of residents that had attended a Parish Council. The new sign would in keeping with the Noak Bridge conservation status. The wooden sign had been replaced by a Basildon Council metal sign. The project had been deferred due to the Covid pandemic. Paul Downes agreed to manage the project and was asked to bring quotations to the next meeting

247/2020 GOVERNMENT CONSULTATION – PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE:

The planning for the future consultation had been circulated to members with a summary from Locality the organisation offering advice and support to Parish Councils and Neighbourhood Forums undertaking Neighbourhood Plans. The main issue for the Council arising from the summary was that Neighbourhood Plans could be watered down if the new plans go ahead. If this was the case what would we be the point of Neighbourhood Planning. The chairman would send a letter to John Baron MP as advised by Locality and respond to the consultation and circulate to members
