549/2022 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

550/2022 ELECTION PARISH COUNCILLOR:

Cllr Christopher Bateman joined the meeting and signed the Declaration of Office of the Noak Bridge Parish Council

551/2022 REGISTER OF INTEREST:

Cllr Bateman signed a copy of the Register of Interest but would need to complete and return to the chairman within 28 days for publication on the website. The chairman reported all other Cllrs had completed the newly adopted LGA Register of Interest/Code of Conduct and they were now published on the website. The chairman reported that many documents had been circulated to all members including Standing Orders; Good Cllr Guide; Financial Regulations

552/2022 CODE OF CONDUCT TRAINING:

Basildon Council provided two sessions of code of conduct training from an external trainer. Cllr's Sargent and Gilliam had attended the first session and informed the meeting all Cllrs were encouraged to attend. Another session will be held in June 2023

553/2022 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN:

Work on the draft Neighbourhood Plan was underway as was the work on the Neighbourhood Plan grant funded projects. A meeting will be taking place with the Parish Council, Basildon Council and Bluestone Planning consultants in November

## 554/2022 LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARIES COMMISSION CONSULTATION:

The chairman reported on the consultation by the Boundaries Commission of the electoral review on local boundaries. There were no proposed changes to the Parish of Noak Bridge, but changes were proposed for the Crouch Ward. The electoral review examines and proposes

- 1. The total number of councillors representing the council's electors
- 2. The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions
- 3. The number of councillors for each ward or division

#### 555/2022 COMMUNITY PROJECTS UPDATE:

#### **Durban Lane Pond:**

Basildon Council informed the Council the reeds were dying off and they would monitor regrowth next year and planting would be undertaken

# **Village Entrance / Exit Signs:**

The Council considered the removal of the plants and boxes in front of the village signs and to return the plants to the owner, proposed by Cllr Dowton, seconded Cllr Bateman - **Agreed** Permission for the new village signs were already in place. Quotations had been obtained for installation, the removal of the plant boxes and plants and to reseed the area at the same time to ensure the signs could be fully seen from the Highway. The chairman will order the signs

The school returned the Little Libraries as the artwork was now complete and they were on display in the village hall. The children and staff painted items that represented and captured the biodiversity of the village. As a thank you to the school and children for their wonderful efforts
