### 56/2023 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE:

The chairman reported the grant award of £8,000 from Groundwork had been fully spent and the end of grant report completed and agreed by Groundwork. The grant had funded the preparation of the pre-submission of the draft plan, detailed policy options, additional plans, review and collate the pre-submission draft and undertake a consultation of the pre-submission draft, amend evidence base review in line with the changes from responses to policies. The results to the survey were low but sufficient to conclude that the Neighbourhood Plan Vision, Policies, Themes and Objectives were met with approval A meeting of the Parish Council and steering group will be set up to agree the draft Neighbourhood Plan when consultation feedback has been included

### 57/2023 ANNUAL RISK ASSESSMENT REVIEW AND ADOPTION STATEMENT OF INTERNAL CONTROL:

The chairman informed the Council of the change in Insurers to BHIB in 2021 with a 3-year agreement term. The policies meet the Council needs, proposed by Cllr Daft, seconded by Cllr Dowton, the annual fee of £900.29 - **Agreed**

### 60/2023 KINGS CORONATION 'BIG HELP OUT' LITTER PICK FEEDBACK:

Cllr Daft reported the event had been well attended by residents from all over the parish and each attendee received a Coronation medal from the Mayor and Youth Mayor of Basildon. The chairman and Cllr Allen allocated litter pick areas to attendees covering the whole parish. Thanks to all litter pickers and to Basildon Council for supplying the equipment and removing all the rubbish collected. Special thanks to Essex County Cllr Tony Ball and Paul Brace the Director of Communities and the Environment for taking part in the 'Big Help Out' litter pick. The chairman delivered the Coronation seeds to litter pickers and spare seeds were given to the school. A news story was posted on the parish website

#### 61/2023 FUNDING APPLICATION:

The council considered a funding application from Noak Bridge Village Residents Association to purchase and install a defibrillator on the rear wall of the Costcutter shop at a cost of £1930.00. Permission has been granted from Basildon Council to install the defibrillator on the building subject to a survey and the shopkeeper has allowed use of the shops' electrical services. Proposed by Cllr Daft to fund the application, seconded by Cllr Dowton - **Agreed** 

#### 62/2023 COMMUNITY PROJECTS UPDATE:

A resident from Saling Green made a request to the parish council to refurbish the wooden sign located on the roundabout. Considering the parish council do not own the sign and the poor condition, the chairman asked Members to have a look at the sign and bring comments back to the next meeting for consideration. The sign is within of the conservation area and an asset of Basildon Council. It is very similar in style to the Bridgecote Lane sign the PC refurbished The parish council sought information from Basildon Council on the repainting of the teen shelter, although the structure was sound the paint is flaking off. The park area equipment is due to be replaced within the next few years as part of Basildon Council Leisure replacement Programme. The area will benefit from the teen shelter being replaced at the same time **The** Parish Council considered the possibility of a joint project to repair the foot path from Lower Street leading to the Costcutter shop which has been brought to the attention of the Council. A ball- park estimated cost from Basildon Council was £15,000 for an overlay repair not a full construction. The Council to seek other funding sources available to enable a viable joint project Two quotations had been received from external contractors to provide and install a small goal post on the South Wash Road playing field. Basildon Council informed the parish council they would expect provision of, a risk assessment, method statement, and public liability insurance from the chosen contractor. The parish council considered the two quotations: 1. Collins Joinery £1,521.92 plus Vat

2. P. Thomas Landscapes £780.00 plus Vat. Proposed by Cllr Bateman to accept P Thomas Landscapes quotation, seconded by Cllr Dowton - **Agreed**

# 67/2023 BOROUGH/COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT

Cllr Allen reported on the local elections held in May Cllr Ball reported, Highways to get extra £17m from Government for road maintenance including potholes. Highways recruiting to Perma Fix potholes, need 12 crews of 5 people, so far recruited 8 crews. Held ECC AGM Gillian Reeves new Chairman of the Council and Ray Gooding Vice Chairman. ECC elections to be held in 2025. Locality Fund, each Councillor allocated £5k, criteria: green, climate change and biodiversity. Members asked if the criteria for applications included work to replace the rotting wood on the stairs in the Nature Reserve,

Footpath 201 was waterlogged and scalpings were being put down to make safe A fund of £36k has been allocated to the YSG for joint funding as part of the Government levelling up programme.

A new school in Lee Chapel is to be built, 2 form entry, 420 children, 0 to 5 included to be called Chapel Hill
