73/2023 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE:

The chairman reported the survey results will be published on the website on receipt of information from consultants. The parish council have been asked if they would like to attend a workshop meeting with Croudace. The Draft Neighbourhood Plan and Design Code is expected within the next couple of months. Working party to be held to discuss next steps

74/2023 COUNCILLOR TRAINING:

Cllrs' Dowton and Gilliam have chosen to attend two modular training sessions at the EALC in October. Session one modules 1 and 2, session two modules 3 and 4 at a cost of £95.00 per session per Cllr. Cllr Bateman was informed that training sessions are available in the evenings on zoom or weekends. Cancellation must be made 2 weeks prior to the session for a full refund The chairman to book modules 1 / 2 and 3 / 4, proposed by Cllr Cottrell, seconded by Cllr Bateman - **Agreed**

75/2023 COMMUNITY PROJECTS UPDATE:

The Defibrillator received full permission from Basildon Council to install on the rear of the Costcutter Shop, including the additional electrical works

The Saling Green Sign: The chairman had taken pictures of the sign and circulated to members Costings for replacing the wooden posts and back panel and refurbishment of the metal sign would be obtained and brought back to the next meeting

Coppice Lane Pond, residents contacted the chairman regarding rubbish in the pond and the overgrown bushes by the footpath, asking if the parish council could fund removing the rubbish and overgrowth. Having looked at the pond it was apparent that other works were needed on the Island. Members were asked if they would like to support the pond as a project, most members declined saying it was for Basildon Council to fund. The chairman agreed with funding the project because residents held it as a popular focal point of the village and would obtain a quotation. Basildon Council will be informed of the rubbish and overgrowth

A resident had informed the parish council that young people were congregating around the teen shelter on the village green with complaints of smashing up the litter bin, rubbish everywhere and smoking pot. The parish council stated the Teen Shelter and MUSA area had been established many years ago as a 'hang out' for young people and is very popular. The parish council would not be in favour of removing the Teen Shelter and consider the young people have just as much right to use the village green as everyone else. Anyone witnessing the smoking of pot should report the incidents to the police. The rubbish will be reported to Basildon Council

81/2023 BOROUGH/COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT

Cllr Ball reported members would be deciding on potholes repairs in the division, each Cllr is allocated 36 potholes. Member funded projects are £8k per Cllr, joint funding required. Basildon Youth Strategy group would be meeting for the last time in July. Cllr Ball will join Cllr Sargent on a visit to the Youth Council. A Green Skills County Summit to educate children in South Essex area in technical skills. Basildon Business Group are leading on engineering written into the school curriculum. A child well being conference to help with anxiety and sporadic non-attendance at school. The reading project was extremely successful and has led to a numbers project to assist with maths
